The Department of Public Health (DPH) will request approval for five (5) retroactive items at the February 1<sup>st</sup> Budget & Finance committee meeting. File 221276 - Apply for Grant - Centers for Disease Control and Prevention - Integrated HIV Surveillance and Prevention Programs for Health Departments - \$7,804,306 - Resolution authorizing the Department of Public Health to submit a one-year application for Calendar Year 2023 to continue to receive funding for the Integrated HIV Surveillance and Prevention Programs for Health Departments from the Centers of Disease Control and Prevention, and requesting \$7,804,306 in HIV prevention funding for San Francisco from January 1, 2023, through May 31, 2024.

- **Description**: These grant funds are awarded to the Department on an annual basis to cover an integrated HIV Surveillance and Prevention Program for San Francisco residents. The funds are utilized to support epidemiological activities required to support this system of HIV surveillance and prevention as well as direct services provided by the Department, or those subcontracted to qualified contractors selected through RFP.
- Reason for Retroactive Request: DPH is respectfully requesting retroactive approval for this grant application. Ordinance No. 265-05 requires that City Departments submit applications at least 60 days prior to the grant deadline for review and approval.
