2 APPOINTING FOUR MEMBERS TO THE DRUG ABUSE ADVISORY BOARD, WAIVING  
3 RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT.

4 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County  
5 of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated  
6 persons to serve as members of the Drug Abuse Advisory Board,  
7 pursuant to the provisions of San Francisco Administrative Code  
8 Section 15.9, for the term specified:

9 Gennie Nunley-Thompson, Seat 2, succeeding Matonia Williams,  
10 must represent law enforcement, new three-year term ending October 1,  
11 2002;

12 Matonia Williams, Seat 6, succeeding Katrina Powell, must  
13 represent the public-at-large or service provider, new three-year  
14 term ending October 1, 2002;

15 Robert Elliott, Seat 12, succeeding Randy Salenfriend, must  
16 represent the public-at-large or service provider, unexpired portion  
17 of three-year term ending October 1, 2000;

18 Frederick Hobson, Seat 13, succeeding Margo St. James, must  
19 represent the public-at-large, unexpired portion of three-year term  
20 ending October 1, 2000.

21 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the  
22 following findings:

- 23 1. The membership of the Drug Abuse Advisory Board has a goal to  
24 be representative of the diversity of the City and County of  
25 San Francisco.

2. Applicant Gennie Nunley-Thompson, a new appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely qualifies him/her to serve on the Drug Abuse Advisory Board.
3. The Drug Abuse Advisory Board has attempted to fill the position, for which Gennie Nunley-Thompson was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Gennie Nunley-Thompson is qualified to serve on the Drug Abuse Advisory Board.
4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Drug Abuse Advisory Board at this time; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Gennie Nunley-Thompson, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires persons appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be residents of the City and County of San Francisco.
