3	Resolution urging GlaxoSmithKline to reconsider its decision to stop distribution of
4	
5	prescription drugs to Canadian pharmacies that sell to U.S. customers.
6	WHEREAS, On January 21, 2003, GlaxoSmithKline, the world's second largest drug
7	
8	maker, stopped shipping its prescription drugs to Canadian pharmacies that sell to American
9	prescription holders on the Internet and will not resume shipment of supplies until these
10	pharmacies stop filling U.S. prescriptions; and
11	WHEREAS, The cost of many prescription drugs are prohibitively expensive especially
	for people on fixed incomes and who do not have insurance; and,
12	WHEREAS, Approximately one-third of senior citizens in the United States are without
13	prescription drug insurance; and,
14	WHEREAS, The General Accounting Office of the United States estimates that a U.S.
15	consumer pays on average one-third more for a prescription drug than a consumer pays for
16	an identical drug in another country; and,
17	WHEREAS, Nearly 1 million American senior citizens purchase prescription
18	medications from Canadian pharmacies; and

20	WHEREAS, For many low income seniors, purchasing prescription drugs from
21	Canadian pharmacies at a discount is the only way they can afford to buy the medication the
22	need to stay healthy; and,
23	WHEREAS, U.S. Representative Pete Stark of California along with 21 members of
	Congress have sent GlaxoSmithKline a letter urging it to reconsider its decision; and,

1	WHEREAS, A national boycott of GlaxoSmithKline products will begin on February 20,
2	2003 to demonstrate the dissatisfaction of the American public with GlaxoSmithKline's policies
3	regarding distribution; now, therefore, be it
4	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
5	urges the Chief Executive Office of GlaxoSmithKline, Jean-Pierre Garnier, to reconsider the
6	decision to stop distribution of supplies to Canadian pharmacies selling prescription drugs to
7	U.S. customers; and, be it
8	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San
9	Francisco urges everyone interested in this issue to support the national boycott of
10	GlaxoSmithKline products until this issue is satisfactorily resolved.
