[Accept-Expend State Grant]

Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Port Commission to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$100,000 from the Association of Bay Area Governments (San Francisco Bay Trail Project) for the Downtown Ferry Terminal Public Pier Project

WHEREAS, The Ferry Terminal Public Pier Project is a component of the Downtown Ferry Terminal Project, currently under construction, that includes a new, freestanding breakwater, which the Port completed in July 2001 at a cost of \$3 million; and

WHEREAS, The proposed Public Pier Project would finish the top of the breakwater with public pedestrian improvements to create a landmark public access fishing and recreation pier, extending 637-feet into the Bay; and,

WHEREAS, The Ferry Terminal Public Pier Project (the "Project") will provide public access improvements on the existing Ferry Terminal breakwater, support recreational fishing and other wildlife-associated recreation uses, and will include interpretive displays on the Bay's natural resources; and,

WHEREAS, The Project is an important part of the Port's Waterfront Land Use Plan; and,

WHEREAS, All relevant agencies, including the Bay Conservation and Development Commission, the Regional Water Quality Control Board, and the Army Corps of Engineers, have issued permits for approval of the Project; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Planning Department adopted and issued a Final Negative Declaration (the "Negative Declaration") pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act on August 7, 1997 and the Federal Highway Administration issued a finding of no

significant impact pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act for the Downtown Ferry Terminal Project, which incorporates the Project; and,

WHEREAS, The Port Commission by Resolution No. 05-02, dated January 11, 2005 authorized the Port's Executive Director to apply for, accept and expend the \$100,000 in San Francisco Bay Trail grant funds for the construction of the Downtown Ferry Terminal Public Pier Project; and,

WHEREAS, The Port Commission now seeks the approval of the Board of Supervisors to apply for, accept and expend funds from the San Francisco Bay Trail Project; and,

WHEREAS, The Port Commission proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the San Francisco Port Commission to apply for, accept and expend \$100,000 in grant funds from the San Francisco Bay Trail Project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the San Francisco Port Commission to execute any documents required for the implementation of this grant, including any amendments, augmentations or extensions thereof; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Executive Director of the Port, or her designee, is authorized to approve, sign and execute an agreement to hold the granting agency harmless from liability arising out of the Project.
