8	WHEREAS, Under Planning Code Section 1004.1, the Board of Supervisors may by
9	resolution initiate landmark designation; and
10	WHEREAS, the 380-seat Clay Theatre, also known as "The Clay," located at 2261
11	Fillmore Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 0630, Lot No. 002, is one of the oldest single
12	screen nickelodeon movie houses in San Francisco; and
13	WHEREAS, the building was constructed strictly as a movie theatre, with no backstage
14	for other types of performances; and
15	WHEREAS, the Naify family, legendary film impresarios, renovated the nickelodeon in
16	1913 and opened the venture as the Regent; and
17	WHEREAS, the theatre, later known as The Avalon, was renamed in 1935 under
18	Herbert Rosener as The Clay International and became one of the most important
19	destinations for foreign and independent films throughout the 20th century; and
20	WHEREAS, theatre architect Vincent Raney later remodeled The Clay Theatre in 1946
21	and it became a top destination for midnight movies; and
22	WHEREAS, in 1972, the Clay Theatre made history and hosted San Francisco's first-
23	ever midnight movie screening with the premiere of John Waters' "Pink Flamingos"; and

1	WHEREAS, in 1985, the Clay Theatre hosted the premiere of the spaghetti western
2	parody "Lust in the Dust," which starred Tab Hunter and Cesar Romero, who also attended
3	the screening, and the movie would later become a cult classic; and
4	WHEREAS, The Clay Theatre became renowned for showing foreign and art-house
5	content, including late night showings of "The Rocky Horror Picture Show" and Tommy
6	Wiseau's "The Room," which drew hundreds of patrons each month; and
7	WHEREAS, many of San Francisco's single-screen movie theatres have closed or
8	have been converted to other uses in the past few decades; and
9	WHEREAS, these single-screen movie theatres are important and unique cultural
10	institutions in San Francisco; and
11	WHEREAS, the Clay Theatre's relatively small scale reflects its age and origins as a
12	nickelodeon; and
13	WHEREAS, the Clay Theatre's physical structure, with art deco design elements and
14	an elegant, simply decorated auditorium that recalls a jewel box, also holds unique
15	architectural and aesthetic interest and value; now, therefore be it
16	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby initiates landmark designation of
17	2261 Fillmore Street (aka the Clay Theatre), Assessor's Parcel Block No. 0630, Lot No. 002
18	and be it
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board requests that the Planning Department
20	prepare a Landmark Designation Report to submit to the Historic Preservation Commission
21	for its consideration of the unique historical, architectural, and aesthetic interest and value of
22	the property; and be it
23	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board requests that the Historic Preservation
24	Commission consider whether the property warrants landmark designation, and submit its
25	recommendation to the Board according to Article 10 of the Planning Code.

1	FURTHER RESOLVED, That Planning Code, Section 1004.2(b), requires the Historic
2	Preservation Commission to respond to landmark designation initiations from the Board within
3	90 days, but that the Board of Supervisors may, by resolution, extend the time within which
4	the Historic Preservation Commission is to render its decision; therefore, in order to allow the
5	Planning Department more time to complete its review of this landmark designation, this
6	Resolution shall also serve as a 90-day extension of that deadline, for a total of 180 days to
7	respond starting from the transmittal date.

San Francisco Heritage strongly supports initiation of city landmark designation of the Clay Theatre at 2261 Fillmore Street. The architectural style and integrity of the Clay, as well as its deep history and significance to the upper Fillmore Street neighborhood, combine to make the former nickelodeon and movie house a deserving city landmark.

The Clay is one of the oldest movie theatres in San Francisco and for years served as a cultural touchstone of the city, showing foreign films and midnight movie screening. Despite recently closing and having its seats insensitively ripped out, the theater building retains its elegant façade and marquee and should receive any protections possible to preserve its appearance and use as one of the last single-screen motion picture theatres.
