9 WHEREAS, It is in the best interest of all California residents and businesses to ensure
10 an adequate supply of energy by encouraging energy production; and

11 WHEREAS, Both the State of California and the City and County of San Francisco are
12 seeking to stabilize energy prices for consumers; and

13 WHEREAS, San Francisco is investigating methods to encourage the production and
14 use of local, sustainable, and clean energy sources; and

15 WHEREAS, San Francisco wishes to act responsibly and pro-actively to control its own
16 growing demand and dependence on the State's limited power resources; and

17 WHEREAS, San Francisco is considering the establishment of a Municipal Utility
18 District with the purpose of developing new power generation capabilities; now, therefore, be it

19 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
20 hereby urges San Francisco's State Assembly, State Senate Delegations and City Lobbyist to
21 oppose the State of California entering into any long-term state energy contracts that would in
22 any way preclude, restrict, or inhibit San Francisco from developing its own power generation
23 capabilities and selling that power to San Francisco residents and businesses.




