

1 [Planning Code - Landmark Designation - Second Church of Christ Scientist]

3 **Ordinance amending the Planning Code to designate the Second Church of Christ**
 4 **Scientist, located at 651 Dolores Street, Assessor's Parcel Block No. 3598, Lot Nos.**
 5 **172-175, on the east side of Dolores Street between Cumberland Street and 20th Street,**
 6 **as a landmark consistent with the standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning**
 7 **Code; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California**
 8 **Environmental Quality Act; and making public necessity, convenience, and welfare**
 9 **findings under Planning Code, Section 302, and findings of consistency with the**
 10 **General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1.**

18 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

19 Section 1. Findings.

20 (a) Environmental and Land Use Findings.

21 (1) The Planning Department has determined that the Planning Code
 22 amendment proposed in this ordinance is subject to a Categorical Exemption from the
 23 California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et
 24 seq., hereinafter "CEQA") pursuant to Section 15308 of California Code of Regulations, Title
 25 14, Sections 15000 et seq., the Guidelines for implementation of the statute, for actions by

1 regulatory agencies for protection of the environment (in this case, landmark designation).
2 Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.
3 _____ and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board of Supervisors affirms
4 this determination.

5 (2) Pursuant to Planning Code Section 302, the Board of Supervisors finds that
6 the proposed landmark designation of the Second Church of Christ Scientist will serve the
7 public necessity, convenience, and welfare for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation
8 Commission Resolution No. _____, recommending approval of the proposed
9 designation, which is incorporated herein by reference.

10 (3) The Board of Supervisors finds that the proposed landmark designation of
11 the Second Church of Christ Scientist is consistent with the General Plan and with Planning
12 Code Section 101.1(b) for the reasons set forth in Historic Preservation Commission
13 Resolution No. _____, which is incorporated herein by reference.

14 (b) General Findings.

15 (1) On March 3, 2026, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 114-
16 26, initiating landmark designation of the Second Church of Christ Scientist as a San
17 Francisco Landmark pursuant to Section 1004.1 of the Planning Code. On March 6, 2026, the
18 Mayor approved the resolution. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
19 Supervisors in File No. 260068.

20 (2) Pursuant to Charter Section 4.135, the Historic Preservation Commission
21 has authority “to recommend approval, disapproval, or modification of landmark designations
22 and historic district designations under the Planning Code to the Board of Supervisors.”

23 (3) The Landmark Designation Fact Sheet dated May 20, 2026 was prepared
24 by Planning Department Preservation staff. All preparers meet the Secretary of the Interior’s
25 Professional Qualification Standards for historic preservation program staff, as set forth in

1 Code of Federal Regulations Title 36, Part 61, Appendix A. The report was reviewed for
2 accuracy and conformance with the purposes and standards of Article 10 of the Planning
3 Code. A copy of the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
4 Supervisors in File No. _____ and is incorporated herein by reference.

5 (4) The Historic Preservation Commission, at its regular meeting of May 20,
6 2026, reviewed Planning Department staff’s analysis of the historical significance of the
7 Second Church of Christ Scientist set forth in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet.

8 (5) On May 20, 2026, after holding a public hearing on the proposed
9 designation and having considered the specialized analyses prepared by Planning
10 Department staff and the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet, the Historic Preservation
11 Commission recommended designation of the Second Church of Christ Scientist as a
12 landmark consistent with the standards set forth in Section 1004 of the Planning Code, by
13 Resolution No. _____. Said resolution is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
14 in File No. _____.

15 (6) The Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the Second Church of Christ
16 Scientist has a special character and special historical, cultural, architectural, and aesthetic
17 interest and value, and that its designation as a landmark will further the purposes of and
18 conform to the standards set forth in Article 10 of the Planning Code. In doing so, the Board of
19 Supervisors hereby incorporates by reference the findings of the Landmark Designation Fact
20 Sheet.

22 Section 2. Designation.

23 Pursuant to Section 1004.3 of the Planning Code, the Second Church of Christ
24 Scientist, located at 651 Dolores Street, Assessor’s Parcel Block No. 3598, Lot Nos. 172-175,
25 is hereby designated as a San Francisco landmark consistent with the standards set forth in

1 Section 1004. Appendix A to Article 10 of the Planning Code is hereby amended to include
2 this property.

4 Section 3. Required Data.

5 (a) The description, location, and boundary of the landmark site consists of the
6 footprint of the Second Church of Christ Scientist, located on Assessor's Parcel Block No.
7 3598, Lot Nos. 172-175, on the east side of Dolores Street between Cumberland Street and
8 20th Street in San Francisco's Mission neighborhood, as shown in the Landmark Designation
9 Fact Sheet.

10 (b) The characteristics of the landmark that justify its designation are described and
11 shown in the Landmark Designation Fact Sheet and other supporting materials contained in
12 Planning Department Record Docket No. 2026-002408DES. In brief, the Second Church of
13 Christ Scientist, located at 651 Dolores Street, is eligible for local designation as an
14 exemplary example of a Beaux-Arts Church in San Francisco, and for its association with
15 post-1906 earthquake and fire reconstruction of the Mission Neighborhood. Completed in
16 1917, the steel-framed concrete and brick church was designed by Architect of Merit William
17 Crim, who was one of the leading architects of the Pacific Coast from 1910-1930. The church
18 was built as the Second Church of Christ Scientist and was used as a church for nearly 90
19 years until it was converted to residential use. The church includes three ornamented facades,
20 temple like portico, and massive hemispherical dome. The parcel lies in an area heavily
21 impacted by the 1906 Fires, known as the burn zone. Along with several other nearby houses
22 of worship, the church was associated with the neighborhood's post disaster recovery efforts,
23 constructed in the Mission neighborhood to be closer to congregants. Sited across the street
24 from Dolores Park (then Mission Park), the church's location was chosen in part because of
25 its scenic location.

1 (c) The particular features that should be preserved, or replaced in kind as determined
2 necessary, are those generally shown in photographs and described in the Landmark
3 Designation Fact Sheet, which can be found in Planning Department Record Docket No.
4 2026-002408DES, and which are incorporated in this designation by reference as though fully
5 set forth herein. This designation does not identify any interior character-defining features.
6 Specifically, the features that are character-defining and shall be preserved or replaced in kind
7 are the exterior elevations, form, massing, structure, rooflines, architectural ornament, and
8 materials of the property, identified as:

- 9 (1) Corner location of the building on the property;
- 10 (2) Rectangular form with side pop-outs;
- 11 (3) One-story height;
- 12 (4) Concrete and brick facades with neoclassical ornamentation, including columns;
- 13 (5) Three decorative facades (west/primary, north/secondary, and south/tertiary)
14 organized in tripartite composition with a rusticated base, smooth vertical shaft,
15 and a bold capital with denticulated cornice and raised attic frieze;
- 16 (6) Flat roof capped by octagonal drum surmounted by a slate-clad, hemispherical
17 dome;
- 18 (7) Entranceway with monumental stone stairs, arched portico supported by four
19 Tuscan columns and three sets of wooden doors;
- 20 (8) Front vestibule with original marble floor, wood wainscoting, and barrel-vaulted
21 plaster ceiling and hanging bronze light fixtures; and
- 22 (9) Large arched, segmented windows symmetrically placed throughout the
23 structure.

25 Section 4. Effective Date.

1 This ordinance shall become effective on the 31st day after enactment. Enactment
2 occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or
3 does not sign the ordinance within 10 days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors
4 overrides the Mayor’s veto of the ordinance.
