24 25 [Resolution urging San Franciscans to avoid burning wood in fireplaces and wood-burning stoves during the winter months and to comply with the Bay Area Air Quality Management District's advisories to "Spare the Air Tonight" in instances where the air quality is especially vulnerable to pollutants from burning wood.]

Resolution urging the residents of the City and County of San Francisco to eliminate or reduce wood burning in residential fireplaces and wood burning stoves as a way to reduce toxic air pollution during the winter months.

WHEREAS, Wood that is burned in fireplaces and wood-burning stoves it is not an efficient combustion process and produces many harmful air pollutants that have been found to cause serious threats to human health; and

WHEREAS, These toxic pollutants include: carbon monoxide (CO) that reduces the blood's ability to supply oxygen to body tissues; oxides of nitrogen (NO2) which impair proper functioning of the respiratory system and its ability to fight infection as well as being a precursor to acid rain and acid fog; volatile organic compounds (VOCs) that form irritating, toxic and/or cancer-causing substances such as benzene, formaldehyde and benzo-a-pyrene; and inhalable particulate matter (PM10 and PM2.5) that remain airborne for weeks and when inhaled stay deep in the lungs, causing irritation and coughing as well as chronic lung diseases and cancer; and

WHEREAS, PM2.5 is most concentrated at night and during the early morning hours when the chilled dense air is still and the pollutants from wood burning the night before are trapped near the earth's surface; and

WHEREAS, US EPA studies show that pollution from burning wood can seep into homes and offices and pollutant levels can be 70% higher indoors than outdoors; and

WHEREAS, The Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD) is starting their first ever wintertime Spare the Air campaign focusing specifically on reducing wood smoke and monitoring air quality for PM2.5; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has adopted a new building ordinance that requires that new installation of fireplaces and wood burning appliances meet strict EPA standards for emissions¹; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The Mayor and Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco support the Bay Area Air Quality Management District's wintertime Spare the Air Tonight program aimed at reducing wood burning in residences and businesses; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor and Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urge all San Franciscans to eliminate or reduce wood burning in fireplaces and wood burning stoves; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor and Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco direct the Department of the Environment to work collaboratively with the Bay Area Air Quality Management District to alert San Francisco residents about Spare the Air Tonight warnings that will be issued by the Air District as a preventative measure to avoid poor air quality.
