David Lee Crosby, succeeding Enola Maxwell, (Seat No. 3, must have interest in and be knowledgeable regarding juvenile delinquency prevention), for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending December 31, 2002;

Julie Pasadas (residency requirement waived), succeeding Maria Rosa Navarro, (Seat No. 19, must have interest in and be knowledgeable regarding juvenile delinquency prevention), for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending June 30, 2003; and, be it FURTHER RESOLVED. That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 1. The membership of the Delinquency Prevention Commission has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.

- 3. FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Julie Pasadas, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
