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3 AUTHORIZING REBUTTAL TO OPPONENT'S BALLOT ARGUMENT AGAINST
4 PROPOSITION D, A CHARTER AMENDMENT REGARDING CATASTROPHIC SICK
5 LEAVE PROGRAM.

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7 IT IS HEREBY MOVED, That pursuant to Section 550 of the Municipal Elections
8 Code, the Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize a rebuttal to opponent's ballot
9 argument against Proposition D, a Charter amendment (Second Draft) amending Sections
10 A8.364 and A8.441, to give the Board of Supervisors the authority to allow City employees
11 to transfer unused sick leave to groups of catastrophically-ill City employees and to transfer
12 vacation credits to other City employees for use as family leave to care for spouses,
13 domestic partners, and other dependents; and be it

14 FURTHER MOVED, That the full text of said argument hereby authorized be shown
15 in the copy attached to this motion and is hereby declared to be a part hereof; and, be it

16 FURTHER MOVED, That the Director of Elections be and is hereby authorized and
17 directed to include said argument in the pamphlet accompanying the sample ballots to be
18 mailed to the voters of the City and County of San Francisco for the election to be held on
19 Tuesday, November 2, 1999.
