URGING THE MUNICIPAL RAILWAY TO INVESTIGATE THE POSSIBILITY OF OFFERING A REDUCED STUDENT RATE FOR ENROLLED UNIVERSITY STUDENTS ATTENDING

COLLEGE WITHIN THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO AND TO REPORT BACK TO THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WITH RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SUCH A

PROGRAM WITHIN EIGHT WEEKS OF PASSAGE OF THIS RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has a Transit First Policy, which encourages the use of public transportation to curb its heavy traffic and congestion problems; and.

WHEREAS, A reduced student rate on Muni fast passes would make students more inclined to ride Muni; and,

WHEREAS, An increase in Muni's ridership would ease traffic congestion, parking problems, and environmental damage, all which are problems that the City's Transit First Policy targets; and,

WHEREAS, Students would also be more inclined to ride Muni if the reduced fare fast passes were issued to the entire student body through a student fee increase; and,

WHEREAS, Muni would be paid a set fee from the participating colleges through these student fee increases, which guarantees the amount of funding Muni would receive; and

WHEREAS, By issuing the passes to the entire student body, Muni would be receiving funds from people who might not normally ride Muni; and,

WHEREAS, A survey conducted by the Associated Students of the University of San Francisco shows that 86% of those polled from a field of 768 students would support an increase in student fees for a Muni fast pass at a reduced rate; and,

WHEREAS, Several San Francisco schools, including University of San Francisco, San Francisco State University, City College, and the San Francisco Conservatory have all expressed their support of a discounted rate for students on the Municipal Railway; and,

WHEREAS, Other cities with similar transit programs, such as University of California Berkeley, Santa Clara, Seattle and University of California Davis, have experienced a great deal of success in increasing student ridership by percentages of 21.3% to 90%; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Municipal Railway to investigate the possibility of offering a reduced student rate for enrolled university students attending college within the City and County of San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Municipal Railway report back to the Board of Supervisors with recommendations for such a program within eight weeks of passage of this resolution; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be sent to the Municipal Railway.
