12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13 Section 1. The Transportation Code, Division I, Article 4, is hereby amended by
14 revising Section 4.4, to read as follows:

15 **SEC. 4.4. SERVICE AUTHORITY ESTABLISHED.**

16 (a) A Service Authority for the Abatement of Abandoned Vehicles is hereby
17 established pursuant to the provisions of Section 22710 of the California Vehicle Code. The
18 members of the Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors shall serve ex officio as
19 the members of the Service Authority for the Abatement of Abandoned Vehicles. Except as
20 otherwise provided in this Article 4, the Service Authority shall have all of the powers and be
21 subject to all of the conditions, restrictions, and obligations that are set forth in *said* Section
22 22710 of the California Vehicle Code.

23 (b) Extension of the service fee of \$1 on vehicles registered to an owner with an
24 address in the City and County of San Francisco for deposit in the Abandoned Vehicle Trust
25 Fund, as permitted by Section 9250.7(g) of the California Vehicle Code, is hereby approved,

1 and the Service Authority for the Abatement of Abandoned Vehicles is authorized to enact a
2 resolution extending such service fee for a ten-year period, from ~~June 1, 2013 through May 31,~~
3 ~~2023, pursuant~~ June 1, 2023 through May 31, 2033 under California Vehicle Code ~~to said~~ Section
4 9250.7(g).

5 Section 3. Effective Date; Retroactivity.

6 (a) This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs
7 when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not
8 sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the
9 Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

10 (b) If the effective date occurs after June 1, 2023, this ordinance shall, upon its
11 effective date, be retroactive to June 1, 2023.

12 Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
13 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
14 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
15 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
16 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
17 the official title of the ordinance.

18 Section 5. Supermajority Vote. Pursuant to Section 9250.7(g) of the California Vehicle
19 Code, passage of this ordinance requires a two-thirds' vote of the Board of Supervisors.

RESOLUTION No. 230418-032

WHEREAS, In 1990, Section 22710 was added to the California Vehicle Code (CVC) to allow counties to establish a Service Authority for the Abatement of Abandoned Vehicles (Service Authority) to administer the Abandoned Vehicle Abatement (AVA) program; and,

WHEREAS, Through the program, abandoned vehicles or vehicle parts that promote blight or constitute a fire or health hazard may be removed from City streets; and,

WHEREAS, Section 9250.7 allows a Service Authority to impose a \$1 AVA fee to mitigate the counties' program costs, to be paid as part of the vehicle registration fee and collected by the Department of Motor Vehicles for each vehicle registered by a county resident; and,

WHEREAS, In 1992, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors established the Service Authority, designated the Department of Parking and Traffic Commission to act as Service Authority, and authorized the Service Authority to impose the AVA fee; and,

WHEREAS, In 2008 the Board of Supervisors transferred the Service Authority responsibilities to the SFMTA Through Transportation Code Division I, Section 4.4(a); and,

WHEREAS, In 2012 the Board of Supervisors authorized extension of the AVA \$1 fee for an additional ten years, until May 31, 2023 through Transportation Code Division I, Section 4.4(b); and,

WHEREAS, The current AVA fee will expire on May 31, 2013; and,

WHEREAS, A two-thirds majority of the BOS must approve the AVA fee renewal; and

WHEREAS, Failure to extend the AVA fee would result in a loss of approximately \$500K annually and lead to a larger expense to the Agency for providing a needed service to investigate and if necessary, remove abandoned vehicles; and,

WHEREAS, Since the public hearing is less than five days after the last publication of notice, the SFMTA Board of Directors is asked to waive Article 4, Section 10 of the SFMTA Board Rules of Order; and

WHEREAS, On April 6, 2023, the SFMTA, under authority delegated by the Planning Department, determined that approving the renewal and collection of the \$1 Abandoned Vehicle Abatement (AVA) fee for a ten-year period from June 1, 2023 until May 31, 2033, and requesting that the Board of Supervisors amend the Transportation Code to approve the extension for ten years until May 31, 2033 is not a "project" under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations Sections

15060(c) and 15378(b); and,

WHEREAS, A copy of the CEQA determination is on file with the Secretary to the SFMTA Board of Directors, and is incorporated herein by reference; now, therefore, be it now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors waives Article 4, Section 10 of the SFMTA Board Rules of Order since the scheduled public hearing is less than five days after the last publication of notice; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency Board of Directors, acting as the Service Authority, approves renewal and collection of the \$1 Abandoned Vehicle Abatement (AVA) fee for a ten-year period from June 1, 2023 until May 31, 2033; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the SFMTA Board requests that the Board of Supervisors, acting by a two-thirds vote, amends Transportation Code Section 4.4(b) to authorize the renewal of the fee from June 1, 2023 to May 31, 2033.

STANDARD FAMILY LAW RESTRaining ORDERS Starting immediately, you and your spouse or domestic partner are restrained from: 1. removing the minor children of the parties from the state or applying for a new or replacement passport for those minor children without the prior written consent of the other party or an order of the court; 2. cashing, borrowing against, canceling, transferring, disposing of, or changing the beneficiaries of any insurance or other coverage, including life, health, automobile, and disability, held for the benefit of the parties and their minor children; 3. transferring, encumbering, hypothecating, concealing, or in any way disposing of any property, real or personal, whether community, quasi-community, or separate, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court, except in the usual course of business or for the necessities of life; and 4. creating a nonprobate transfer or modifying a nonprobate transfer in a manner that affects the disposition of property subject to the transfer, without the written consent of the other party or an order of the court. Before revocation of a nonprobate transfer can take effect or a right of survivorship to property can be eliminated, notice of the change must be filed and served on the other party.

You must notify each other of any proposed extraordinary expenditures at least five business days prior to incurring these extraordinary expenditures and account to the court for all extraordinary expenditures made after these restraining orders are effective. However, you may use community property, quasi-community property, or your own separate property to pay an attorney to help you or to pay court costs.

*Subject: Request for Approval of the renewal of a \$1 Fee Collected by the CA DMV
in support of San Francisco County's Abandoned Vehicle Abatement Program*

Honorable Members of the Board of Supervisors:

The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) respectfully requests that the Board of Supervisors (Board) approve the extension and collection of a \$1 fee to offset costs for investigation, noticing and abatement of vehicles or vehicle parts, for a term of ten years, from June 1, 2023, through May 31, 2033.

In 1990, Section 22710 was added to the California Vehicle Code to allow counties to establish a Service Authority to administer the Abandoned Vehicle Abatement (AVA) program. Through the program, abandoned vehicles or vehicle parts that promote blight or constitute a fire or health hazard may be removed from City streets. Section 9250.7 of the Vehicle Code allows the Service Authority to collect a \$1 fee to offset the counties' program costs. The \$1 fee is paid as part of vehicle registration fees collected by the California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). Funds collected are apportioned by the DMV to all participating counties.

Section 9250.7 provides that the AVA fee expires after ten years but may be renewed for up to ten years with approval of the county's board of supervisors by a two-thirds vote. Upon such approval, the Service Authority may impose the AVA fee for an additional period of up to ten years.

In 1992, the Board established a Service Authority for the City and County of San Francisco and designated the members of the Department of Parking and Traffic Commission to serve ex officio as the members of the Service Authority, and approved imposition by the Service Authority of the AVA fee (Ordinance No. 228-92.). The Board designated the SFMTA Board of Directors (SFMTA Board) to serve as the Service Authority in 2008. (S.F. Transportation Code Section 4.4(a).)

In 2013, the Board authorized renewal of the AVA to run from June 1, 2013, until May 31, 2023 (Resolution No. 101-13). In order to continue the program the Board, by a two-thirds vote, must



approve extension of the fee until May 2033, and the SFMTA Board must impose the \$1 AVA fee for an additional ten years.

AVA Program Summary

Most vehicle abatement requests are received from San Francisco residents. SFMTA Parking Enforcement investigates and if the vehicle is parked at the location reported, a warning notice is posted on the vehicle instructing the owner to move the vehicle within the five days (extended from the standard 72-Hour notice). The posted warning gives written notice that the vehicle may be towed. An officer returns five days later and if the vehicle was not moved, the vehicle is towed. Enforcement submits an annual report that is used to complete the AVA submission report.

If, during an investigation, Enforcement suspects that the vehicle in question is being used for vehicular housing and the owner is present, they work with the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (DHS), the Healthy Streets Operations Center (HSOC) and the City’s San Francisco Homeless Outreach Team (HOT) to provide proactive outreach to people living in their vehicles. The primary goal of this work is to connect people living in their vehicles with health care, services, and alternative housing options. In addition, officers mark the vehicle to indicate whether the vehicle is in violation. Vehicles not in violation will have no further action taken.

The number of vehicles investigated, and the number and percentage abated for the last ten fiscal years are listed in the table below.

Funding Impact

The vehicle abatement \$1 fee collected by the DMV offsets the cost to abate abandoned vehicles. Failure to extend collection of the fee would result in higher costs to the City and County for vehicle abatement, as shown the table below:

To continue to receive funds to offset the costs of investigation, noticing and abatement of abandoned vehicles, the SFMTA recommends approving the extension of the collection of \$1 per registered vehicle fee from June 1, 2023, to May 31, 2033.
