Ordinance amending the San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code to update the City's Conflict of Interest Code.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code is hereby amended by amending Sections 3.1-103, 3.1-105, 3.1-120, 3.1-130, 3.1-140, 3.1-145, 3.1-150, 3.1-155, 3.1-175, 3.1-195, 3.1-205, 3.1-207, 3.1-218, 3.1-225, 3.1-245, 3.1-251, 3.1-253, 3.1-275, 3.1-280, 3.1-285, 3.1-320, 3.1-335, 3.1-345, 3.1-365, 3.1-390, 3.1-410, 3.1-420, 3.1-422, 3.1-435, 3.1-445, 3.1-455, 3.1-500, 3.1-510 to read as follows:

SEC. 3.1-103. FILING OFFICERS.

- (a) Every appointing authority whose appointees file statements required by Sections 3.1-101 and 3.1-102 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code with the Ethics Commission shall provide written notice to the Ethics Commission of the name of any appointee who has assumed or left office or employment. Such notice shall be provided within 15 days of the City officer or employee assuming or leaving office or employment. Failure to provide such notice may constitute official misconduct.
- (b) Whenever the Mayor or a board or commission appoints a department head, or receives the resignation or retirement notice of a department head, the official or the secretary to the board or commission who makes the appointment or receives the resignation or retirement notice, shall inform the department head of the necessity to file within 30 days of assuming office or leaving office a statement of economic interests. The official or the secretary of the board or commission who makes the appointment or receives the resignation or retirement notice shall also inform the Ethics Commission of the appointment, resignation or retirement within 15 days of the department head's assumption of or departure from office. Such written notice shall include the name of the department head, and the date on which the department was appointed, resigned or retired. Upon receiving notice of the appointment, or the resignation or retirement, of the department head, the Ethics Commission shall perform the required duties of the filing officer and obtain the required statement of economic interests.
 - SEC. 3.1-120. AIRPORT-COMMISSION.

Persons in this category shall disclose all investments and business positions in business entities and income from any source which provides, or contracts with the City and County of San Francisco and its Airport Commission to provide services, supplies, materials, machinery or equipment to the Airport Commission.

- (b) Disclosure Category 3. Persons in this category shall disclose all interests in real property, and all income from and investments in business entities which hold interests in real property in this jurisdiction, and all business positions held in such business entities.
- (c) Disclosure Category 4. Services and Equipment. Persons in this category shall disclose income, investments and business positions in (1) business entities that manufacture or sell supplies, books, machinery or equipment of the type utilized or purchased by the department for which the designated employee is manager or director; or (2) business entities that are contractors or subcontractors engaged in the performance of work services of the type utilized or purchased by the department for which the designated employee is manager or director.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the date of passage.

Section 4. Operative Date. This ordinance shall become operative on January 1, 2013.

Section 5. This section is uncodified. In enacting this Ordinance, the Board intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers,

punctuation, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent part of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code that are explicitly shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the legislation.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code – Updating Conflict of Interest Code]

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code to update the City's Conflict of Interest Code.

Existing Law

The Political Reform Act of 1974, California Government Code § 87300, *et seq.*, requires that San Francisco adopt a Conflict of Interest Code and review and update the Code every two years. The City's Conflict of Interest Code is set forth in Article III, Chapter 1 of the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code. The Code designates those City officials and employees who periodically must file public statements disclosing their personal financial interests. The Code also specifies the types of financial interests – *i.e.*, disclosure categories – that designated officials and employees must disclose.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed amendments to the Conflict of Interest Code add, delete, and change the titles of designated employees to reflect organizational and staffing changes made by City departments and agencies since the Code was last amended in 2010. The proposed amendments also revise the disclosure requirements applicable to some designated officials and employees.

The proposed amendments amend the sections of the Conflict of Interest Code governing the following local agencies: Airport, Board of Appeals, Arts Commission, Assessor-Recorder, Board of Supervisors, Department of Building Inspection, City Attorney, Controller, Office of Economic Workforce and Development, Department of Emergency Management, Department of the Environment, Fine Arts Museums, General Services Agency – City Administrator, General Services Agency – Department of Technology, Department of Human Resources, Human Rights Commission, Human Services Agency, Municipal Transportation Agency, Planning Department, Port, Public Utilities Commission, Recreation and Park, Retirement System, San Francisco Unified School District, Office of Small Business, Transportation Authority, Treasurer – Tax Collector, and Department on the Status of Women.

The proposed amendments also delete the section of the Conflict of Interest Code governing the Redevelopment Agency.

Background

The City's conflict of interest code must list those employees and officers who make or participate in the making of governmental decisions on behalf of the City. 2 C.C.R. § 82019(a)(3). A City employee or officer "makes a governmental decision" when he or she:

(1) votes on a matter; (2) appoints a person; (3) obligates or commits his or her agency to any course of action; or (4) enters into any contractual agreement on behalf of his or her agency. *Id.* § 18702.1. A City employee or officer "participates in making a governmental decision" when he or she directly, without significant substantive review: (1) negotiates with a governmental entity or private person regarding a governmental decision; or (2) advises or makes recommendations to the final decision-maker by conducting research or an investigation, or preparing or presenting a report, analysis or opinion. *Id.* § 18702.2. The City's conflict of interest code should not include employees who carry out solely clerical or ministerial tasks. *See id.* § 18702.4 (a).

A "filing officer" is the officer with whom any original statement of economic interests is required to be filed. Cal. Gov. Code § 82027. Filing officers are required to supply the necessary forms, determine whether the required forms have been filed, notify persons who have failed to file correctly, and report apparent violations to the appropriate agency. 2 C.C.R. § 18115(a). A "filing official" makes and retains a copy of a statement of economic interests and forwards the original statement to the appropriate filing officer. *See* Durant Adv. Ltr., CA FPPC Adv. A-02-299, 2002 WL 31819179 at *1-2 (Dec. 4, 2002); County Clerk Adv. Ltr., CA FPPC Adv. A-99-030, 1999 WL 129903 at *1 n.2 (Feb. 25, 1999); 2 C.C.R. § 18115(b).

The Fair Political Practices Commission is the filing officer for the District Attorney, Treasurer, members of the Board of Supervisors, City Administrator, City Attorney, Mayor, and members of the Planning Commission. Cal. Gov. Code § 87500(e)-(g). For these officials, the filing official is the Ethics Commission.
