RYAN WHITE FUNDS TO STATE AND LOCAL COUNTY GOVERNMENTS BECAUSE OF THE POTENTIALLY SEVERE DISRUPTION OF SERVICES TO HIV/AIDS PATIENTS.

WHEREAS, Ryan White was a hemophiliac from Kokomo, Indiana who contracted AIDS through tainted blood infusion and passed away in 1990 at age 19;and

WHEREAS, The Ryan White Care Act was passed by Congress in 1991 in honor of Ryan White and has dispersed over \$6.4 billion to state and local governments to provide medical care to AIDS/HIV patients who don't qualify for Medicaid, but who don't have medical insurance; and

WHEREAS, Oklahoma Republican Congressman Tom Coburn will be introducing legislation to amend the Ryan White Care Act; and

WHEREAS, Under the current Ryan White Act, federal funds are dispersed to states and counties with the highest number of AIDS cases reported; and

WHEREAS, Coburn's amendments would designate the number of new HIV infections reported rather than the total number of AIDS cases as the criteria for qualifying for federal funds; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco currently receives \$35 million annually from Ryan White funds and would stand to lose \$8 million annually if the amendment passes; and

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi is opposed to any amendments which would decrease funding for San Francisco and has vowed to maintain continued funding for the various medical and education programs funded through Ryan White funds, including a proposal to freeze the revenue stream to San Francisco at within two percent of the current \$3.3 million; and

WHEREAS, Any attempts to drastically change the funding formula for the disbursement of Ryan White funds will cause severe disruption to existing services and even endangering the lives of HIV patients; and

WHEREAS, Nationally and internationally renowned model HIV/AIDS treatment programs as well as culturally specific programs designed specifically for communities of color will be threatened; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby supports Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi's efforts to maintain current levels of Ryan White funds to the City and County of San Francisco; and let it be

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby supports

Congresswoman Nancy Pelosi's proposal to introduce amendments to freeze the revenue stream of Ryan White funds to San Francisco at within two percent of the current \$3.3 million; and let it be

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby opposes Oklahoma Congressman Tom Coburn's amendment to revise the funding formula for the disbursement of Ryan White funds to state and local county governments because of the potentially severe disruption of services to HIV/AIDS patients.
