

Resolution authorizing the Recreation and Park Department to retroactively accept and expend a gift-in-place valued at \$164,760 from the San Francisco Conservation Corps to rehabilitate trails and retaining walls at Buena Vista Park.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Recreation and Park Department owns real property known as Buena Vista Park located at Haight Street and Buena Vista Street; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Conservation Corps ("SFCC") received a State Proposition 84 grant to rehabilitate trails and retaining walls in Buena Vista Park; and

WHEREAS, The SFCC is proposing to provide labor and materials valued at \$164,760, as a gift-in-place ('Gift") to the City; and,

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2010, the Recreation and Park Commission recommended to the Board of Supervisors to accept and expend the Gift as Resolution No. 1004-002 ("Commission Resolution"); now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department to retroactively accept and expend the Gift valued at \$164,760 from the San Francisco Conservation Corps for the Buena Vista Park Project.

Dear Ms. Morse-West:

This letter serves to address your ADA compliance questions related to the Buena Vista Park Project. On July 9th, I met with Kevin W. Jensen, ADA Coordinator for the Department of Public Works, to discuss approval the Buena Vista Park Southeast Slope Improvement Project. He confirmed that the project, inclusive of work proposed to be funded by Land and Water Conservation Funds (LWCF), is in compliance with the American Disability Act under programmatic accessibility. The programmatic element of this park is access to scenery and we demonstrated that the ADA accessible path in construction would achieve these goals.


In terms of the LWCF project trail area, the existing trail was evaluated for ADA access improvements. To achieve ADA accessibility, it would require that the site be significantly altered due to the natural topography, sandy soils and severe erosion issues on the southeast slope. This is deemed contrary to the conservation requirements, and as a result only stabilization work was proposed to be done in this area. The ADA coordinator considers this to be trail maintenance and therefore is not required to meet ADA compliance. Another condition of departure from ADA compliance is the prevailing construction practices. As stated in the grant application, the San Francisco Conservation Corps will perform the proposed work on the trail. This agency provides construction training opportunities for young people and the crew working the project will be using hand tools to complete such tasks as grading trails, grubbing plants, construction of small retaining walls and wooden stair rehabilitation.

In terms of ADA access to the lawn area, the path of travel to the area commences at the location of the future ADA parking spot and drop-off zone. However, at this point the park visitors' path of travel moves along the existing sidewalk. The existing sidewalk leading to the lawn area meets all the ADA criteria of a walkway people with disability require with the exception of the grade and the grade of the sidewalk is only required to meet the grade of the street. According to Mr. Jensen, when a project is considered a remodel (as opposed to new construction), not all paths of travel need to be repaired, therefore, we are not required to modify the sidewalk to meet ADA grade requirements.

Congratulations! The California Conservation Corps (CCC) has approved your Buena Vista Public Safety project for funding in Fiscal Year 2008/09 pursuant to the Safe Drinking Water, Water Quality and Supply, Flood Control, River and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2006, Proposition 84 [Public Resources Code 75050(I)(2)].

However, due to the current limited availability of bond funding, project work <u>CANNOT</u> begin and costs <u>CANNOT</u> be incurred until you have received further written notice from the CCC for these activities to commence.

Additionally, this project is also contingent upon successful completion of California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Compliance. No project work can begin until this contingency is lifted, in writing, by the CCC.

Once you receive written notice that work can begin and costs can be incurred, the **Project Performance Period (PPP)** for this project will be from <u>June 30, 2009</u> through <u>May 31, 2011</u>. Eligible program costs can be submitted to the CCC for reimbursement for work performed during this time period only.

Attached, please find a fully executed grant agreement with original signatures between the CCC and San Francisco Conservation Corps for this project. Please retain this document in your project files.

Additionally, the CCC will email you a copy of the FY 2008/09 Proposition 84 grant administration packet containing all the forms needed for reporting, payment requests, etc., throughout the life of the project. Forms are also available on the CCC's website (www.ccc.ca.gov) under the Proposition 84 link.

Please note that throughout the project, you are required to report progress to the CCC quarterly. Additionally, any changes in the scope of work, project end date or changes due to unforeseen circumstances must be reported to the CCC for advance approval before work continues.

To Whom It May Concern:

The San Francisco Recreation and Park Department acknowledges that corpsmember labor is being provided by the San Francisco Conservation Corps for the Buena Vista Park Project, Phase II. It is further understood that funding for this labor is being provided through Proposition 84, the Safe Drinking Water, Water Quality and Supply, Flood Control, River and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2006.

San Francisco Recreation and Park Department understands that bond funds granted by the State of California require land tenure and site control requirements, pursuant to the amount of bond funds invested in the project.

It is intended that land upon which a project improvement is made will be owned, operated and maintained by the sponsor for a period of:

- 10 years for grant amounts up to and including \$100,000
- 20 years for grant amounts greater than \$100,000 but up to and including \$1,000,000
- 25 years for grant amounts over \$1,000,000

San Francisco Recreation and Park Department acknowledges that project work is intended to be maintained for the period of time indicated above, and gives San Francisco Conservation Corpts the authority to construct, the project, and begin the project work, in accordance with the Grant Agreement provisions. When San Francisco Conservation Corps will not operate and maintain the project on an ongoing basis, the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department acknowledges that the San Francisco Recreation and Park Department will assume the responsibility of operating and maintaining the improvements as indicated above.
