## CONDEMNING THE SERIES OF HATE MOTIVATED ASSAULTS AGAINST THE GAY COMMUNITY IN SAN FRANCISCO, SACRAMENTO, AND BOSTON AND URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO SUPPORT THE HATE CRIMES PREVENTION ACT

WHEREAS, Reminiscent of the recent brutal assault and murder of Matthew Shepard, another 21 year old gay man, Brad Davis, was assaulted and left to die in a ditch off Interstate 80 in Sacramento on December 6, 1998; and

WHEREAS, Despite suffering two fractured vertebrae along his spine, six broken ribs on the left side, three broken ribs on the right side, ankles fractured on both legs, chipped teeth, cuts on the tongue and two black eyes, Brad Davis survived the heinous attack and remains in critical condition; and

WHEREAS, On December 4, 1998 in San Francisco, an anonymous man stumbled into St. Mary's Medical Center seeking help after having been assaulted and anti-gay epithets written all over his body; and

WHEREAS, On October 31, Halloween Night, another gay San Franciscan man was assaulted by six men on Church and Market Street and sustained permanent hearing damage, blows to the head which required stitches, and injuries to hip and face; and

WHEREAS, On December 4, 1998 in Boston. William Hester, a 34 year old transgender man and nightclub performer was found murdered; and

WHEREAS, These recent series of attacks against the gay and transgender men is indicative the virulent homophobia which pervades our country and condemns the gay community to live in fear and uncertainty; and

WHEREAS, It has become even more urgent for City governments and law enforcement agencies to assume a proactive role in the protection of the human rights of Gay

Americans and other Americans who are perceived to be different because of race, ethnicity, religion, gender, or physical ability; and

WHEREAS, The citizens of the City and County of San Francisco deplore hateful attacks against lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender persons; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco condemns the assault of Brad Davis, the murder of William Hester, and countless other victims of hate-motivated violence; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges both Senate and the House of Representatives to support the Hate Crimes Prevention Act which will broaden the federal bias laws to cover sexual orientation.
