WHEREAS, Congregation Sha'ar Zahav provides for the education of their youth in Shabbat morning classes and Hebrew language classes in Kadimah, Sha'ar Zahav's religious school; and,

WHEREAS, Congregation Sha'ar Zahav supports many activities in the Jewish, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender communities, the Mission District and the wider Bay Area including: collecting non-perishable goods for the San Francisco Food Bank, delivering meals for Project Open hand, participating in the Ron Wilmot Bike Ride for Project Inform. beautifying the AIDS Memorial Grove, participating in the annual "Sukkot in April" effort, participating in the annual Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Freedom Day Parade,

building houses with Habitat for Humanity, serving meals to the residents of neighborhood shelters, participating in the annual Jewish Community Federation Campaign, adopting a Covenant of Sanctuary, participating in Israel Independence Day, serving on boards of local and national Jewish gay and AIDS agencies, and many more community service efforts; and,

WHEREAS, Congregation Sha'ar Zahav publishes The Jewish Gaily Forward, a prizewinning monthly newsletter that is a model for the Reform congregations across the nation; and,

WHEREAS, Congregation Sha'ar Zahav is currently celebrating its 25 year anniversary of being a major force in the re-shaping of modern Jewish understanding in the San Francisco community and around the world; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends Congregation Sha'ar Zahav for twenty-five years of outstanding leadership and contribution to the Jewish, lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities of San Francisco.
