

[MAJOR NARCOTICS GRANT - STATE FUNDS]

1 AUTHORIZING RETROACTIVELY THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY OF THE CITY AND
 2 COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND FUNDS IN
 3 THE AMOUNT OF \$130,054 MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL
 4 JUSTICE PLANNING FOR A PROJECT ENTITLED "SAN FRANCISCO DISTRICT
 5 ATTORNEY'S OFFICE MAJOR NARCOTIC VENDORS PROSECUTION PROGRAM",
 6 FOR THE TWELVE MONTH PERIOD JULY 1, 1999 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2000, AND
 7 WAIVING INDIRECT COSTS DUE TO FUNDING CONSTRAINTS.

9 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco desires to undertake a certain project
 10 designated the Major Narcotic Vendors Prosecution Program to be funded in part from funds
 11 made available in accordance with the statutory effort to support enhanced prosecution efforts,
 12 Penal Code Section 13880-13884 administered by the Office of Criminal Justice Planning
 13 (hereafter "OCJP"); now, therefore, be it
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15 RESOLVED, That the District Attorney of the City and County of San Francisco is
 16 authorized retroactively to apply for, accept, and expend funds in the amount of \$130,054 for the
 17 purpose of implementing the Major Narcotic Vendors Prosecution Program from OCJP for the
 18 twelve month period July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000; and, be it

20 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the District Attorney is authorized to sign and approve on
 21 behalf of the City and County of San Francisco the necessary Grant Award Agreement for Major
 22 Narcotic Vendor Prosecution purposes including any extensions or amendments thereof; and,

24 IT IS AGREED, That there are no matching funds required for said project under the
 25 Major Narcotic Vendor Prosecution Program and the rules and regulations of OCJP; and,

1 IT IS AGREED, That any liability arising out of the performance of the Grant Award
2 Agreements, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the grant
3 recipient and the authorizing agency. The State of California and OCJP disclaim responsibility
4 for any such liability; and,


5 IT IS AGREED, That indirect costs to the City and County of San Francisco shall be

9 supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
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


