AUTHORIZING RETROACTIVELY THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$130,054 MADE AVAILABLE THROUGH THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING FOR A PROJECT ENTITLED "SAN FRANCISCO DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE MAJOR NARCOTIC VENDORS PROSECUTION PROGRAM", FOR THE TWELVE MONTH PERIOD JULY 1, 1999 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2000, AND WAIVING INDIRECT COSTS DUE TO FUNDING CONSTRAINTS.

RESOLVED, That the District Attorney of the City and County of San Francisco is authorized retroactively to apply for, accept, and expend funds in the amount of \$130,054 for the purpose of implementing the Major Narcotic Vendors Prosecution Program from OCJP for the twelve month period July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2000; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the District Attorney is authorized to sign and approve on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco the necessary Grant Award Agreement for Major Narcotic Vendor Prosecution purposes including any extensions or amendments thereof; and,

IT IS AGREED, That there are no matching funds required for said project under the Major Narcotic Vendor Prosecution Program and the rules and regulations of OCJP; and,

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IT IS AGREED, That any liability arising out of the performance of the Grant Award Agreements, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency. The State of California and OCJP disclaim responsibility for any such liability; and,

IT IS AGREED, That indirect costs to the City and County of San Francisco shall be waived due to funding constraints; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
