Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to require the Department of Public Works to provide the new Department of Sanitation and Streets with administrative support, including human resources, performance management, finance, budgeting, technology, emergency planning, training, and employee safety services; and amending the Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code to require Public Works Commissioners, Sanitation and Streets Commissioners, and the Director of Sanitation and Streets to file Form 700 (Statement of Economic Interests).

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Background and Findings.

- (a) On November 3, 2020, the voters approved Proposition B, which amended the Charter to create a Department of Sanitation and Streets ("Department") to succeed to specific duties then and presently performed by the Department of Public Works, and a Sanitation and Streets Commission ("Commission") to oversee the Department, as well as a Public Works Commission to oversee the Department of Public Works.
- (b) On December 14, 2021, the Board of Supervisors approved Motion No. M21-181 establishing July 1, 2022, as the "Transition Date," which, according to Charter Section

- 4.139(d), added by Proposition B, dictates various deadlines relating to the establishment of the Commission and the Department.
- (c) Pursuant to Charter Section 4.138(a), the Department "shall come into existence three months after the Transition Date for the Sanitation and Streets Commission in Section 4.139(d)."
- (d) Pursuant to Charter Section 4.138(d), also added by Proposition B, no later than the Transition Date, the Board of Supervisors shall, by ordinance, require "the City Administrator, the Department of Public Works, and/or any other City department to provide administrative support for the Department, which shall include but need not be limited to human resources, performance management, finance, budgeting, technology, emergency planning, training, and employee safety services." In addition, Section 4.138(d) states that "any time more than two years and three months after the Transition Date, the Board of Supervisors may adopt ordinances requiring the Department ... to assume responsibility for some or all of that administrative support."

Section 2. Chapter 2A of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Article XXVIII, consisting of Section 2A.440, to read as follows:

ARTICLE XXVIII: DEPARTMENT OF SANITATION AND STREETS SEC. 2A.440. DEPARTMENT OF SANITATION AND STREETS.

- (a) In accordance with Charter Section 4.138, there shall be a Department of Sanitation and Streets, which shall come into existence on October 1, 2022. The Department shall be headed by the Director of Sanitation and Streets, in accordance with Charter Section 4.138.
- (b) In accordance with Charter Section 4.138(d), starting July 1, 2022, and notwithstanding any contrary provisions of the Municipal Code, the Department of Public Works shall provide administrative support for the Department of Sanitation and Streets, which shall include human

Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
