





The purpose of this letter is to respectfully request to be placed on the Board's calendar for Public Convenience and Necessity approval with regard to our Type 48 license transfer within District 6.

We have enjoyed three good years with "The Lark Bar" in this wonderful neighborhood, adjacent to our "Cask Store". However, change is upon us, and we are planning to move around the corner from our current home at the Hearst Building to the historic Monadnock Building at 685 Market Street. The reason for this relocation of both businesses is due to the pending conversion of the Hearst Building to a boutique hotel which was recently granted planning approval. The current Hearst Building locations of Cask and The Lark Bar would become the lobby of the proposed new hotel.

We are excited with the possibility of keeping The Lark Bar in the neighborhood, pending approval of our ABC License Transfer. The proposed new location is the space formerly occupied by "Jeffrey's Toys", which has been shuttered for four years.
