Resolution commending Kathleen Connell and Michael Valerio, founders of the Folsom Street Fair.

WHEREAS, Kathleen Connell founded the Folsom Street Fair in 1984 with Michael Valerio, who is now deceased, after a series of redevelopment battles in the South of Market Area in the 1970s and 1980s; and,

WHEREAS, the efforts of the two founders represent a long San Francisco tradition of valuing the distinctiveness of neighborhoods and seeking to preserve their value and character; and,

WHEREAS, the two founders modeled the Folsom Street Fair on
Harvey Milk's use of the Castro Street Fair to mobilize, energize,
organize, and unify a community, and then broadened the scope to
include a coalition of all South of Market Area communities including
gays, lesbians, leather activists, elderly residents, Filipinos,
African-Americans, artists, and small business owners; and,

WHEREAS, the first Folsom Street Fair, "MEGAHOOD", set the tone for the ones that followed by being run with disciplined resources, attended beyond expectation by over 30,000 people, and able to return a sizable profit of over \$20,000 to charity; and,

WHEREAS, The Folsom Street Fair has come to symbolize the community with a sense of humor and resilience in the face of AIDS by uniting fun with community empowerment, mixing celebration with

education, building stronger communities while raising funds, and becoming a completely unique San Francisco institution that embodies the joyous individuality, diversity, and determination of people living and experimenting in alternative lifestyles; and,

WHEREAS, The Folsom Street Fair, now in its 18th year, has become the largest leather event in the world, the 3rd-largest single-day event in the state, and the 4th largest single-day event in the country with over 300,000 people attending and over \$250,000 given to charities last year; and,

WHEREAS, The Folsom Street Fair, over its 18-year history, has returned close to a billion dollars in charitable giving, hotel and sales tax revenues to the City, and increased revenues to local businesses; and,

WHEREAS, Michael Valerio, throughout the remainder of his life, continued to make important contributions to the Folsom community, the City and County of San Francisco, and the community at large; and,

WHEREAS, Kathleen Connell served as curator of "The Power of Broken Hearts. MEGAHOOD: The Origin and Evolution of the Folsom Street Fair. Celebration and South-of-Market Community Empowerment in the Age of AIDS" which is the first major exhibition on the history of this key, international event and the first conscious attempt to document its history; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco, does hereby commend Kathleen Connell and Michael Valerio for their dedication and service to our city; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors calls upon the residents of San Francisco to remember the many achievements and contributions of Michael Valerio to the many communities that he touched.
