9 10	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors' legislative tracking system is currently obsolete
11 12	and is not supported by Microsoft or the vendor, Daystar; and WHEREAS, During the Board of Supervisors approval of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2003-04
13 14	annual budget, the issue of the need to replace the legislative tracking system was discussed; and
14	WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors approval of the FY 2003-04 annual budget
16	included authorizing the Clerk of the Board to collect funds from enterprise departments for
17	placement of official advertising in adjudicated newspapers and to recoup payments for ads
18	placed during FY 2002-03; and
19	WHEREAS, The Office of the Clerk of the Board has made a concerted effort during
20	the FY 2002-03 budget to reduce its line item expenditures; and
21	WHEREAS, The Office of the Clerk of the Board has estimated a savings of \$257,563
22	from FY 2002-03 which may be reduced by \$100,000 pending recouping the funds from
23	enterprise departments for placement of official advertising; now therefore be it
24	MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Clerk of the Board to carry
25	forward from the Fiscal Year 2002-03 Budget, unexpended annual budget appropriations in
