REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC TO CONDUCT A CITYWIDE STUDY OF PEDESTRIAN CROSSWALK CLOSURES AND TO PROPOSE REOPENING CLOSED CROSSWALKS IF DOING SO WOULD NOT JEOPARDIZE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

WHEREAS, Pedestrian safety is of utmost concern to the Board of Supervisors and the public in general; and.

WHEREAS, Numerous crosswalks in San Francisco are closed to pedestrians, which makes crossing intersections inconvenient; and,

WHEREAS, Closed crosswalks direct pedestrians to make additional street crossings than would otherwise be necessary; and,

WHEREAS, Closed crosswalks may encourage pedestrians to cross streets illegally, thereby putting their own safety and that of others on the street at risk; and,

WHEREAS, Virtually all citizens are pedestrians on a regular basis; and,

WHEREAS, Alternative traffic measures, such as pedestrian head starts, scrambles and traffic bulbs, can allow crosswalks to be reopened at intersections once considered unsafe for pedestrians; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Department of Parking and Traffic (DPT) to conduct a Citywide study of pedestrian crosswalk closures; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPT include in such a study the feasibility of employing alternatives to crosswalk closures; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPT regularly consult with pedestrian activists and neighborhood interests throughout the process; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPT propose reopening closed crosswalks if doing so would not jeopardize pedestrian safety.
