[Cow Palace State Tax Collection]

URGING THE CALIFORNIA STATE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION TO INTENSIFY ITS EFFORTS TO ENFORCE THE COLLECTION OF STATE SALES TAXES FOR FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION SOLD AT THE COW PALACE.

WHEREAS, The 1-A District Agricultural Association, otherwise known as the "Cow Palace," is a State agency of the California Department of Food and Agriculture's Division of Fairs and Expositions; and,

WHEREAS, The Cow Palace is the host of various events open to the general public, including the Crossroads of the West Gun Show; and,

WHEREAS, Sales at the Cow Palace include ammunition clips over 10 rounds, light armor piercing ammunition, shredding ammunition, 50 caliber ammunition, hand grenade casings, 20mm cannon rounds, rocket launchers, military style assault weapons. Uzi style machine pistols, and 50 and 30 caliber military machine guns; and,

WHEREAS, There are reports of firearms and ammunition being sold at the Cow Palace without the collection of state sales taxes or the issuance of a receipt documenting the collection of state sales taxes; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the California State Board of Equalization to intensify its efforts to enforce the collection of state sales taxes for firearms and ammunition sold at the Cow Palace; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the State Board of Equalization to work with the California Department of Food and Agriculture to ban noncompliant gun dealers from the Cow Palace; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the State Board of Equalization to work with the California State Legislature and appropriate State agencies to

impose additional penalties against delinquent gun dealers, including the revocation of gun dealer licenses; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board forward a copy of this resolution to the California State Board of Equalization, the California Department of Food and Agriculture, and the delegation from San Francisco in the California State Legislature.
