9 WHEREAS, Under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as
10 amended, and related Federal Regulations, the City and County of San Francisco is eligible to
11 apply for and receive a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG); and,

12 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco anticipates receiving approximately
13 \$22,267,380 in 2010/11 CDBG Program funds from HUD, and currently has approximately
14 \$4,886,000 in Program Income from previous CDBG grants, for a combined total of
15 approximately \$27,153,380; and,

16 WHEREAS, The Citizen's Committee on Community Development (CCCD) has
17 prepared recommendations for fiscal year 2010/11 CDBG and program income funding as set
18 forth in a proposed Expenditure Schedule, a copy of which is located in Board File No.
19 100503; and,

20 WHEREAS, The proposed grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance
21 amendment; and,

22 WHEREAS, The funding agency (HUD) does not allow use of grant on indirect costs;

1 WHEREAS, An Environmental Review Record has been prepared by the Mayor's
2 Office of Housing (MOH) and approved by the Certifying Officer for the proposed projects and
3 activities set forth in the Expenditure Schedule with the National Environmental Policy Act
4 (NEPA) and other applicable statutes and authorities, in particular those cited in 24 CFR Part
5 58 §§5 and 6, a copy of which is located in Board File No. 100503; and,

6 WHEREAS, The Certifying Officer shall follow the provisions of NEPA to confirm and
7 ensure that all projects funded under the CDBG Program are in compliance with applicable
8 federal regulations and requirements; now, therefore, be it

9 RESOLVED, That the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco is hereby
10 authorized to apply for, accept, and expend the City's 2010 CDBG Program funds from HUD
11 and expend an estimated \$4,886,000 in Program Income, all in accordance with the purposes
12 and goals for the funding as generally set forth in 2010-14 Five Year Consolidated Plan and
13 the Expenditure Schedule; and, be it





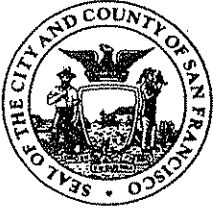
