



STOREFRONT OPPORTUNITY GRANT

Deployed \$2.1M to 71 small businesses, 50 of which are BIPOC owned businesses, and resulted in the opening of 20 small businesses into our Downtown

COMMERCIAL LEASING SERVICES

Assisted over 150 Businesses with leasing services, resulting in 34 signed leases citywide

HOSPITALITY INITIATIVE

Trained 117 job seekers, and **placed 104 into hospitality** careers

EVENTS AND ACTIVATIONS

Funded over 200 events and activations, resulting in the

attraction of over 350.000 attendees
