

1 [Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - Department of Justice - Comprehensive Opioid,
2 Stimulant, and Substance Use Site-Based Program - \$1,600,000]

3 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and**
4 **expend a grant in the amount of \$1,600,000 from the Department of Justice for**
5 **participation in a program entitled, “Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance**
6 **Use Site-Based Program,” for the period of October 1, 2024, through September 30,**
7 **2027; and delegating authority under Charter Section 9.118(a) to the Director of Health**
8 **to approve a Grant Agreement between the City, acting by and through the Department**
9 **of Public Health, and the Department of Justice, for a term of three years from October**
10 **1, 2024 to September 30, 2027, and for a total not to exceed amount of \$1,600,000.**

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12 WHEREAS, The Department of Justice (DOJ) has agreed to fund the San Francisco
13 Department of Public Health (DPH) in the amount of \$1,600,000 for the period of October 1,
14 2024, through September 30, 2027; and

15 WHEREAS, DPH, through its Office of Overdose Prevention, will implement the
16 program entitled Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use Site-Based Program;
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18 WHEREAS, The purpose of this program is to develop a comprehensive, collaborative,
19 and innovative Overdose Fatality Review (OFR), incorporating key partners from across San
20 Francisco; and

21 WHEREAS, Expected outcomes include establishing a comprehensive and
22 collaborative OFR; timely, actionable, community-responsive, and locally-specific overdose
23 fatality data; enhanced collaboration across healthcare, public safety, justice-involved, and
24 community partners; enhanced understanding of service gaps and identification of potential
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1 touchpoints for overdose interventions; and the identification of local, context-specific
2 solutions to prevent overdose; and

3 WHEREAS, Charter, Section 9.118(a), requires Board of Supervisors' approval by
4 Resolution of any contract that when entered into has anticipated revenue of \$1 million dollars
5 or more; and

6 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and

7 WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because DPH received
8 the award letter on November 15, 2024, for a project start date of October 1, 2024; and

9 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs in the amount of
10 \$16,178; now, therefore, be it

11 RESOLVED, The funds accepted for this grant shall be placed into the Board of
12 Supervisors' reserve until released; and, be it

13 FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept a grant
14 in the amount of \$1,600,000 from the DOJ; and, be it

15 FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors delegates their authority to release
16 these funds to the Budget and Finance Committee and the Clerk of the Board is directed to
17 schedule a hearing at the Budget and Finance Committee to duly review the complete file and
18 consider the release of the funds to the Department of Public Health; and, be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health shall be hereby
20 authorized to expend the grant award of \$1,600,000 upon the release of funds from the Board
21 of Supervisors' Reserve; and, be it

22 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby delegates authority
23 under Charter Section 9.118(a) to the Director of Health to approve the Grant Agreement with
24 the Department of Justice for use of these grant funds with a total not to exceed amount of
25 \$1,600,000, for a term of three years from October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2027, for

1 implementation of the program, entitled “Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance
2 Use Site-Based Program”; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That within 30 days of the Grant Agreement being fully
4 executed by all parties, the Department of Public Health shall submit to the Clerk of the Board
5 of Supervisors a completely executed copy for inclusion in File No. 241216. This requirement
6 and obligation resides with the Department, and is for purposes of having a complete file only,
7 and in no manner affects the validity of approved Grant Agreement.
