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8 WHEREAS, At the June 7, 2016, election, San Francisco voters approved Proposition  
9 B, a charter amendment that extends the Park, Recreation, and Open Space Fund; and

10 WHEREAS, Proposition B includes Charter, Section 16.107(g) that states, “the  
11 Department shall develop, and the Commission shall adopt, a set of equity metrics to be used  
12 to establish a baseline of existing Recreation and Park services and resources in low-income  
13 neighborhoods and disadvantaged communities, compared to services and resources  
14 available in the City as a whole;” and

15 WHEREAS, The Equity Metrics shall be used in developing an equity analysis of  
16 Recreation and Park services, resources, and capital expenditures in the department's  
17 Strategic Plan, Capital Expenditure Plan, and Operational Plan; and

18 WHEREAS, The Recreation and Parks Commission plans to consider a proposal for  
19 the Equity Metrics at its August 18, 2016, meeting; now, therefore, be it

20 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby supports/opposes the Recreation and  
21 Park Commission’s proposed Equity Metrics; and, be it
