3 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Children Youth and Their**
4 **Families to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$500,000 from David and**
5 **Katherine deWilde to support community and school-based organizations that provide**
6 **math and literacy programming for the Summer Together Program for the period of**
7 **June 1, 2022, through September 30, 2022.**

9 WHEREAS, The Department of Children Youth and Their Families (DCYF) applied for
10 funding on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco for the David and Katherine
11 deWilde Grant; and

12 WHEREAS, David and Katherine deWilde will distribute a grant of \$500,000 to the City
13 and County of San Francisco for the support to community and school-based organizations to
14 provide math and literacy programming for Summer Together Program June 1, 2022 through
15 September 30, 2022; and

16 WHEREAS, Any interest earned on the grant funds will go to the funded activities; and

17 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and

18 WHEREAS, DCYF proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program
19 expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

20 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes DCYF to accept and expend
21 the grant of \$500,000 from David and Katherine deWilde for the support to community and
22 school-based organizations to provide math and literacy programming; and, be it

23 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
24 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

1 FURTHER RESOLVED, That DCYF is hereby authorized to expend the interest
2 income earned on this grant from David and Katherine deWilde; and, be it

3 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor, or alternatively the Executive Director of
4 DCYF, is hereby authorized to act on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco in
5 connection with the David and Katherine deWilde award, and to enter into, execute, and
6 deliver any and all documents required or deemed necessary or appropriate to be awarded
7 the David and Katherine deWilde award, and all amendments thereto, including the grant
8 proposal for this funding and the Grant Agreement with David and Katherine deWilde; and, be
9 it

10 FURTHER RESOLVED, That grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to
11 supplant expenditures controlled by this body; and, be it

12 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco agrees to abide by
13 the terms and conditions of the Grant Agreement as set forth by David and Katherine
14 deWilde; and, be it

15 FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the agreement being fully
16 executed by all parties, DCYF shall provide a copy to the Clerk of the Board for inclusion into
17 the official file.



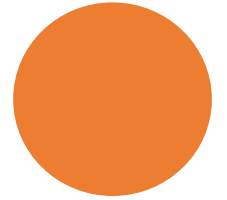
Summer Together Program Grants

The San Francisco village supporting our children, youth & families



Background

- The Department of Children Youth and Their Families (DCYF) initially partnered with San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) and community-based organizations (CBOs) on the Summer Together Program in 2021.
- With the success in 2021, DCYF continued to bring CBOs, nonprofits, businesses, and City departments together to offer in-person summer experiences for our highest need and hardest to reach youth in 2022.
- Summer Together 2022 provides opportunities for youth to engage, rebuild, and reestablish positive attitudes towards learning, relationship building, and social/emotional wellness.





Grants Supporting Summer Together 2022

- Crankstart is a family foundation based in San Francisco. They have supported San Francisco Summer Together since 2021.
- This year Crankstart provided a grant of \$15,937,000 outright to support San Francisco Summer Together and up to an additional \$7,000,000 will be matched dollar for dollar contingent upon DCYF raising up to \$7,000,000 from private donors by June 30,2022.
- David and Katherine deWilde contributed \$500,000 to San Francisco Summer Together 2022 as the match funds for the Crankstart grant.

Proposed Funding Plan

- To allocate Summer Together funding to community and school-based organizations to support summer programming that focuses on literacy and math support, academic supports, social/emotionally learning, behavioral and mental health support, career/college supports, and enrichment and physical activities.
- To provide over 25,000 summer slots to highest priority and hardest to reach youth which includes foster care, public housing/SRO, underhoused/homeless, low income Asian, African American, Latinx and Pacific Islander youth.

Summer Together 2022 will provide:

- Comprehensive wellness support for young people & their families
- Social and Emotional Learning support
- Literacy and Math support
- Project-based enrichment and physical activities
- High school credit recovery & college/career prep

GRANT AMOUNT AND GRANT TERM

Donors intend to make a grant or cause a grant of \$500,000 to San Francisco Department of Children, Youth, and Their Families (DCYF) for 2022 Summer Together program (6/1/22-9/30/22).

This grant agreement does not represent, nor is it intended to create a legally binding pledge for the Donors, the Donors’ estate(s), or any other party to make a grant or any payment to the City and County of San Francisco or to DCYF.

GRANT PURPOSE

The grant is intended to be used to support expenses pertaining to math and literacy programming for Summer Together program for Summer 2022. Donors expect that any earnings with respect to the grant funds be used to support Summer Together 2022 activities.

GOALS

1. DCYF is expected to allocate “Summer Together” funding to community and school-based organizations to support summer programming that focuses on literacy and math support, academic supports, social/emotionally learning, behavioral and mental health support, career/college supports, and enrichment and physical activities.
2. DCYF is expected to provide over 25,000 summer slots to highest priority and hardest to reach youth which includes foster care, public housing/SRO, underhoused/homeless, low income Asian, African American, Latinx and Pacific Islander youth.

TERMS

- Grantee hereby irrevocably and unconditionally agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Donors and agents, and all of the Donors' related entities from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses and expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) directly, indirectly, wholly or partially arising from or in connection with the grant, or in any way relating to the subject of this Agreement. This paragraph shall survive the termination of this Agreement.
