2	Section 1. Article XVI of Chapter 2A of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by

6	(a) Definitions.
7	For purposes of this Section 2A.246, the following terms have the following meanings:

3	(c) Oversight and Management.
4	(1) The Small Business Commission shall provide oversight of the Office of Small

6	(2) The Office of Small Business shall report annually to the Small Business
7	Commission on the activities and expenditures of the Program.
8	(3) The Office of Small Business shall manage the Program, including but not limited to

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(4) Financial and Business Assistance to Landlords of Legacy Businesses. To
provide incentives for landlords to enter into long-term leases with Legacy Businesses and secure the
future stability of San Francisco's long-operating businesses, the Fund may be used to provide other
financial assistance, business assistance, incentives, and programs to landlords of Legacy Businesses,
consistent with any rules and regulations approved by the Small Business Commission.
(5) Marketing, Promotions, Branding, and Programmatic Expenses. To maintain San
Francisco's cultural identity and to foster civic engagement and pride, the Fund may be used to fund
marketing, promotions, branding, and programmatic expenses to support Legacy Businesses and
landlords of Legacy Businesses and other related programmatic expenses, with management by the
Office of Small Business.
(e) Rules and Regulations.
(1) Within six months of the effective date of the ordinance in Board of Supervisors File
No. 240088 enacting this Section 2A.246, and before the disbursement of any monies from the Fund,
the Small Business Commission shall, after a noticed hearing, adopt such rules and regulations
necessary to implement this Section 2A.246 and achieve the purposes identified in subsection (d),
including but not limited to eligibility criteria and application procedures for grants from the Fund.
Rules and regulations shall become final in accordance with subsection $(e)(2)$ .
(2) Any rules and regulations adopted under the authority of subsection (e)(1) shall be
subject to disapproval of the Board of Supervisors by ordinance. The Small Business Commission shall
provide written notice to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of its adoption of any rule or regulation
under subsection (a), along with a copy of said rule or regulation. If a Member of the Board of
Supervisors does not introduce an ordinance to disapprove the rule or regulation within 30 days of the
date of delivery of such notice to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, or if such an ordinance is
introduced within the 30-day period but the ordinance is not enacted by the City within 90 days of the

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1	date of the Commission's delivery of notice to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the rule or
2	regulation shall become final.
3	
4	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
5	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
6	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
7	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
8	
9	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
10	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
11	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
12	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
13	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
14	the official title of the ordinance.

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## LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Legacy Business Assistance Program]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to create the Legacy Business Assistance Program.

## **Existing Law**

Administrative Code Section 2A.246 would create a new program.

# Amendments to Current Law

Section 2A. 246 would create the Legacy Business Assistance Program. This program would administer a Legacy Business Assistance Program Fund, which would be used for grants and financial and business assistance to Legacy Businesses and landlords of Legacy Businesses, as well as marketing, promotions, branding, and programmatic expenses to support Legacy Businesses. The Small Business Commission would oversee the Program. The Office of Small Business would manage the Program; would report annually to the Small Business Commission on the activities and expenditures of the Program; and would adopt rules and regulations for the Program, subject to disapproval by the Board of Supervisors.



# Background Information

Currently, Administrative Code Section 2A.243, Legacy Business Historic Preservation Fund, authorizes the City to provide grants to Legacy Businesses and landlords of Legacy Businesses, and sets forth eligibility criteria, application procedures and grant amounts. Section 2A.246 would not supersede Section 2A.243, but instead would be an additional program to support Legacy Businesses.

On February 26, 2024 the Small Business Commission (the Commission) heard BOS File 240088– Legacy Business Assistance Program. Richard Kurylo, Legacy Business Program Manager, Office of Small Business, presented the legislation.

This legislation would create a Legacy Business Assistance Program and Fund within the Administrative Code to be used for grants, financial assistance, and business assistance for Legacy Businesses and landlords of Legacy Businesses. Currently, the Legacy Business Program administers Rent Stabilization Grants to property owners with Legacy Business tenants. Many, but not all, property owners share a portion or all of the Rent Stabilization Grants directly with Legacy Businesses. The new Program and Fund would ensure that at least 50 percent of the grant funding goes directly to Legacy Businesses for new applicants.
