ENDORSING CONTINUED PLANNING ACTIVITIES FOR A LONG-TERM CARE INTEGRATION PILOT PROJECT (AB 1040) TO IMPROVE SERVICES FOR OLDER AND DISABLED ADULTS

WHEREAS, the State adopted Assembly Bill 1040 which establishes the Long-Term Care Integration Pilot Program; and,

WHEREAS, the State's goals are that pilot projects developed by participating counties: (1) integrate the financing and administration of long-term care services; (2) improve the availability and effectiveness of long-term care services; and (3) maximize the independence of older and disabled adults; and,

WHEREAS, the State's objectives are that pilot projects developed by participating counties: (1) provide a continuum of social and medical services that foster consumer independence and self-reliance, and (2) allow consumers to remain integral members of their communities; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors created the Long-Term Care Pilot Project Task Force to develop a comprehensive plan for the improvement of long-term care services in San Francisco, designating the Department of Public Health as lead agency; and,

WHEREAS, the goal for San Francisco's Pilot Project is to develop a delivery system model that improves access to a scope of services for persons who require long-term care, stressing the importance of home and community-based alternatives while recognizing the continuing value of institutional care; and,

WHEREAS, over the next 12 months, the Task Force will be undertaking planning activities and completing the comprehensive plan to improve service delivery for older and disabled adults in order to move San Francisco's Pilot Project closer toward implementation; and,

WHEREAS, to support this planning effort the Board of Supervisors previously adopted Resolution No. 907-99, authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and expend planning grants (with applicable matching requirements) and to enter into similar agreements with the State Office of Long-Term Care if a grant is renewed or recurs; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors endorses the continuation of these planning activities for a Pilot Project, and the overall project coordination that will be supported by such planning grants, as well as the development of a comprehensive plan to improve long-term care services for older and disabled adults in San Francisco.
