

1 [Adopt-A-Street Program]

2 RESOLVING THAT EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS SHALL ADOPT A
3 STREET AS PART OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS' PROGRAM TO CREATE
4 PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS THAT MAKE OUR CITY'S NEIGHBORHOODS AND
5 COMMERCIAL CORRIDORS CLEANER AND MORE ATTRACTIVE.

7 WHEREAS, The increasing density of population within San Francisco, both resident
8 and tourist, has led to an increase in the need for public cleaning services; and,

9 WHEREAS, In response to this need, on September 19, 1998, Mayor Willie L. Brown
10 Jr. and the San Francisco Department of Public Works (DPW) implemented a new
11 neighborhood cleaning program called Adopt-A-Street; and,

12 WHEREAS, Adopt-A-Street creates public-private partnerships to make our city's
13 neighborhoods and commercial corridors cleaner, more attractive, and therefore more inviting
14 and safe; and,

15 WHEREAS, Adopt-A-Street encourages businesses, neighborhood associations, and
16 residents to "adopt" an area and take responsibility for keeping that area clean; and,

17 WHEREAS, The North of Panhandle Neighborhood Association was the first residents'
18 group to sign-up for Adopt-A-Street; and,

19 WHEREAS, Mark A. Primeau, Director of DPW, Supervisor Gavin Newsom, and
20 Treasurer Susan Leal have adopted streets in Bernal Heights, the Marina, and Jordan Park
21 respectively; now, therefore, be it

22 RESOLVED, That each member of the Board of Supervisors shall adopt a separate
23 area for the Adopt-A-Street program; and be it

24 FURTHER RESOLVED, that each Supervisor shall coordinate his or her efforts in
25 implementing Adopt-A-Street with the DPW Adopt-A-Street Coordinator, Karin Flood.




