Overview of Grant



Behavioral Health Continuum Infrastructure Program (BHCIP):

- **Funder:** CA Department of Health Care Services (DHCS)
- **Third Party Administrator:** Advocates for Human Potential, Inc. (AHP)
- **Amount:** Not to exceed (NTE) amount of \$33,736,105
 - BOS accepted the grant in FY24 Appropriations Ordinance
- **Project:** Adolescent partial hospitalization and acute inpatient psychiatric units, 1001 Potrero Avenue, Building 5
- **Resolution:** Requesting authority for DPH to retroactively accept nonstandard terms in the grant agreement with DHCS through AHP

Improvements to 1001 Potrero, Building 5



- Grant will fund **new 12-bed psychiatric inpatient hospital facility for youth/adolescents aged 12-17**
 - New 24/7 medical unit located at ZSFG
 - Placements into these settings arise from a 5585 involuntary hold due to concerns for danger to themselves or others
- Increases opportunities for inpatient psychiatric care for San Francisco youth within the City and County of San Francisco
 - Currently only one adolescent inpatient psychiatric unit in San Francisco

Non-Standard Terms in Agreement



- Enter into agreement with DHCS for **grant funding** of \$33,736,105
- The City agrees to record a **Declaration of Restrictions** for 1001 Potrero, Building 5 on portions of the 6th and 7th floors consistent with the terms and purpose of Prop C and grant funding for the period of at least 30 years;
- Obligation for the City to **defend, indemnify and hold DHCS harmless**
- Authorization for the State to **apply for a Receiver** in the event of the City's default

Retroactivity Statement



- We are seeking **retroactive authorization** to accept non-standard terms in BHCIP agreement from DHCS through its 3rd party administrator AHP.
 - The award letter was received on December 1, 2022.
 - The award agreement template was received on April 27, 2023.
 - The grant funds were accepted and appropriated by the Board in the FY2023-24 appropriations Ordinance No. 144-23 (File No. 230644)
- After discussions between the City Attorney's Office and AHP, DPH decided to accept the non-standard terms in the agreement.
- **DPH respectfully requests retroactive approval of this item.**
