10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
11	Section 1. Background.
12	(a) The Urban Forestry Council was established by Ordinance No. 171-03 to serve as
13	an advisory body to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors on urban forestry issues. The
14	Council is comprised of members representing the full range of urban forest stakeholders,
15	including City departments, non-profit organizations, educators, community members, and
16	industry professionals.
17	(b) Section 1202 currently provides that the Urban Forestry Council shall be composed
18	of eleven voting members. The Board of Supervisors appoints seven voting members; the
19	Mayor appoints two voting members; and the Director of the Department of Public Works and
20	the Director of the Planning Department (or their respective representatives) each are voting
21	members. Section 1202 also provides that the Council shall have advisory members
22	comprised of representatives from the Recreation and Park Department, the Public Utilities
23	Commission, the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency, and the Golden Gate National
24	Recreation Area.
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1 (c) The San Francisco Redevelopment Agency was dissolved on February 1, 2012. 2 As a result, the advisory member seat dedicated to the San Francisco Redevelopment 3 Agency is vacant. To fill the seat left vacant by the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency, Section 1202 should authorize the Port of San Francisco to appoint a representative as a 4 5 voting member of the Council.

6 (d) Under Section 1202(a)(3), the Director of the Department of Public Works and the 7 Director of the Planning Department (or their respective designees) are voting members. 8 However, the representative members from the Recreation and Park Department and Public 9 Utilities Commission are not voting members. To increase the effectiveness of the Urban 10 Forestry Council at carrying out its role in advising the Mayor and Board of Supervisors on critical issues relating to urban forestry, all Council members should have equal standing and 11 12 be voting members.

13 (e) Under Section 1202, the Urban Forestry Council is to meet once a month. 14 Between 2009 and 2013, the Council averaged nine meetings per year, which has been 15 sufficient for the Council to effectively and efficiently carry out its general business. In addition to the regular Council meeting, the Landmark Tree Committee and Planning and Funding 16 17 Committee meet frequently throughout the year, as needed.

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Section 2. The Environment Code is hereby amended by revising Section 1202, to 19 20 read as follows:

21 SEC. 1202. COUNCIL COMPOSITION AND ADMINISTRATION.

22 (a) Council members will represent the full range of urban forest stakeholders 23 including City agencies, non-profit organizations, tree management organizations, and 24 community members. The Council shall be composed of *eleven fifteen* voting members. 25

(1) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint seven voting members:

1	(A) One member from an educational organization involved with tree
2	management (University of California Cooperative Extension, etc.);
3	(B) Two members certified by a professional tree management organization
4	(International Society of Arboriculture, American Society of Consulting Arborists, or American
5	Society of Landscape Architects, etc.);
6	(C) Two members of non-profit organizations involved in urban forestry or other
7	environmentally-related issues; and
8	(D) Two members from the community.
9	(2) The Mayor shall appoint two voting members:
10	(A) One member from the tree care industry; and
11	(B) One member at large.
12	(3) <i>The following departments shall have voting members: <u>The Director or General</u></i>
13	Manager of each of the following departments, or his or her designee, shall each serve as a voting
14	<u>member:</u>
15	(A) The Director of the Department of Public Works; or his or her designee; and
16	(B) The Director of the Planning Department-or his or her designee.; and
17	(b) The Council shall have advisory members comprised of representatives from the
18	following departments:
19	(1)(C) The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department.; and
20	(2) The Public Utilities Commission. In addition, the San Francisco Redevelopment
21	Agency and the Golden Gate National Recreation Area are invited to send representatives to sit as
22	advisory members of the Council.
23	(4) The Public Utilities Commission shall appoint one voting member.
24	(5) The Golden Gate National Recreation Area is invited to appoint one voting member. If
25	the Golden Gate National Recreation Area does not make an appointment within 60 days after the seat

1 is vacant, the Presidio Trust may appoint one voting member to serve that term. If the Presidio Trust 2 does not make an appointment within 30 days after it is authorized to do so, the Mayor shall appoint an 3 at-large member to fill the seat for the duration of that term. (6) The Port of San Francisco shall appoint one voting member. 4 5 (c)(b) Council members shall serve for two years. A Council <u>Members</u> member can may 6 serve successive terms if reappointed by the *body authority that* originally *appointing appointed* 7 the Council member. Council members serve at the *will pleasure* of the *body appointing* 8 *authority* that appoints each Council member, as specified above. The *body* appointing 9 authority that appoints Council members also may appoint at-large members to serve any unfilled Council positions. 10 11 $\frac{d}{d}(c)$ The Council shall meet at least six times per year. once each month. 12 (e)(d) The Council shall establish its own operating procedures, which, at a minimum, 13 shall meet the public notice, meeting, voting, agenda and other procedural requirements set forth in local law. 14 15 (f)(e) Subcommittees shall be created to adequately address other special areas of concern on an as needed basis. 16 17 (g)(f) The Department of the Environment, with adequate funding to assist the Council 18 in carrying out its mission, shall provide professional and administrative staff to the Council. 19 (h)(g) All members of the Council shall serve without compensation. 20 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after 21 22 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the 23 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance. 24 25
