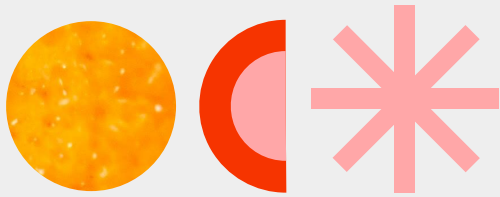




Job Centers Keep People Housed

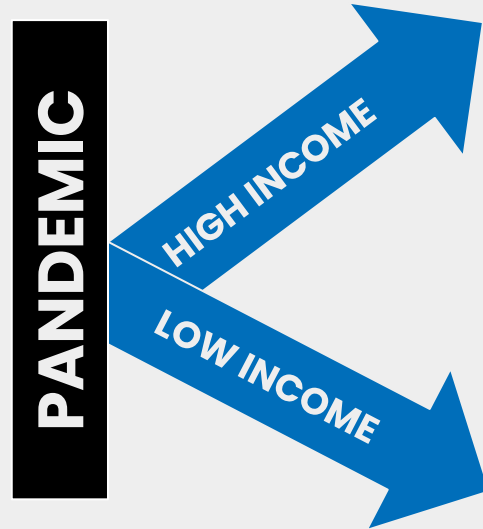


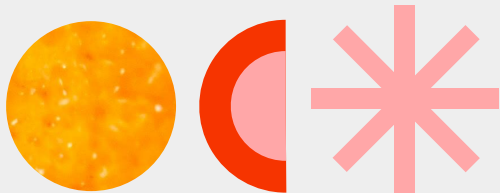

- Workforce Access = Economic Recovery

Recovery Has Not Reached Everyone

- Across San Francisco, immigrant workers are sustaining the economy while being shut out of it.
- Immigrant data reflects that over 1,200 residents looking for work, nearly **1 in 4** are navigating barriers to formal employment, **overwhelmingly Latino (94%)**, and often **monolingual Spanish speakers**, which are still expected to survive without access, protection, or stability.
