Motion concurring in actions taken by the Mayor in the Forty-First Supplement to the Proclamation of Emergency to meet the ongoing local emergency related to the novel coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic by requiring City policy bodies to hold meetings by teleconference or other remote technology, subject to exceptions for: 1) City policy bodies that receive permission to meet in person to act on personnel matters; 2) beginning on January 8, 2022, the Redistricting Task Force; and 3) City policies bodies that receive permission to meet in person based on a finding that holding an in-person meeting would provide a significant benefit to the public; and requiring members of City policy bodies to be fully vaccinated by January 31, 2022.

WHEREAS, On February 25, 2020, Mayor London N. Breed declared a local emergency to exist in connection with the spread of the novel coronavirus COVID-19; and WHEREAS, The Mayor transmitted a copy of that Proclamation Declaring the Existence of a Local Emergency to the Board of Supervisors (the "Proclamation"), and on March 3, 2020, the Board of Supervisors concurred in the Proclamation and in the actions taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; the Proclamation and the Board's concurring motion are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 200228;

31, 2020, required that public meetings of City commissions, boards, and advisory bodies other than the Board of Supervisors and its committees occur by teleconference or other electronic means without providing a physical meeting place, and authorized the Mayor to waive the requirement and allow members of such a body to convene at a physical location

WHEREAS, The Twenty-Fourth Supplement to the Mayor's Proclamation, issued July

1	for the sole purpose of discussing and/or taking action on an item concerning a personnel					
2	matter; and					
3	WHEREAS, The Thirty-Eighth Supplement to the Mayor's Proclamation required					
4	members of City Policy Bodies to submit to the City proof of their vaccination status by					
5	December 15, 2021, and prohibited members of City Policy Bodies from attending or					
6	participating in any in-person meetings unless they are fully vaccinated; and					
7	WHEREAS, Although it is difficult to predict how the pandemic will progress in the					
8	coming months, the Mayor anticipates that the City will likely be in a position to allow City					
9	commissions, boards, and advisory bodies to begin meeting in person again on February 28,					
10	2022, and to ensure that the City is fully prepared for City policy bodies to begin meeting					
11	safely in person on February 28, 2022, it is critical that policy body members be fully					
12	vaccinated by no later than January 31, 2022; and					
13	WHEREAS, On December 17, 2021, the Mayor took additional steps to meet the					
14	emergency by issuing the Forty-First Supplement to the Proclamation, ordering two actions to					
15	meet the emergency; the Forty-First Supplement is on file with the Clerk of the Board of					
16	Supervisors in Board File No. 211319; and					
17	WHEREAS, Government Code, Sections 8550 et seq. and Charter, Section 3.100,					
18	provide for the concurrence by members of the Board of Supervisors in such emergency					
19	declaration and in action taken by the Mayor to meet the emergency; now, therefore, be it					
20	MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors concurs with the following actions taken by the					
21	Mayor to meet the local emergency included in the Mayor's Forty-First Supplement to the					
22	Proclamation, dated December 17, 2021, as such actions are described in full in the Forty-					
23	First Supplement and summarized as follows:					
24	Action 1: Amending Section 2 of the Twenty-Fourth Supplement to the					

Emergency Proclamation to require that public meetings of City commissions, boards, and

advisory bodies other than the Board of Supervisors and its committees occur by
teleconference or other electronic means, provided, however, that: 1) a City policy body may
meet in person with written permission from the Mayor or Mayor's designee to allow
discussion of or action on an item concerning a personnel matter, subject to compliance with
vaccination requirements and other applicable orders; 2) beginning January 8, 2022, the
Redistricting Task Force may convene at a physical location for regular or special meetings,
without advance permission from the Mayor, subject to compliance with vaccination
requirements and other applicable orders; and 3) a City policy body may meet in person with
written permission from the Mayor upon a showing that holding an in-person meeting would
provide significant benefits to the public, subject to compliance with vaccination requirements

Action 2: In addition to the requirements imposed in the Thirty-Eighth Supplement to the Mayor's Proclamation, requiring all members of City Policy Bodies to be fully vaccinated by no later than January 31, 2022, deeming any member of a City policy Body who is not fully vaccinated on February 1, 2022 to be unqualified for office, and providing that failure of a City policy body member to be fully vaccinated on or after February 1, 2022, shall be official misconduct. For purposes of this Order, "fully vaccinated" means two weeks after completing the entire recommended series of vaccination with a vaccine authorized to prevent COVID-19 by the FDA, and "City policy body" means a City board, commission, committee, task force, or other legislative or policy body established by the Charter, City Ordinance, or California statute and that is subject to the open meeting requirements of the Ralph M. brown Act, and all subcommittees of such bodies.
