NO more! We respectfully demand Mayor Breed, the Board of Supervisors, and the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing withdraw the proposal for another homeless shelter foe 315 mentally ill drug addicts, ex-convicts and sex offenders at 711 Post Street to be supervised by an organization with zero direct management experience. This is not progress, it is shameful.

Geographic equity is warranted! Everyone knows homelessness and people with social service needs are located everywhere in SE from the Bay to the ocean! There are homeless tents in the Inner Richmond district and Taraval too. Ocean beach is full of used drug needles and other drug paraphrenia. Just ask those who live and work there. Therefore, it makes good sense and important policy for other supervisory districts and neighborhoods besides the Lower Nob Hill and Tenderloin to have the opportunity.

There has never been an equitable distribution of social services or homeless services in San Francisco and the current HSH authoritarian policies and procedures is to continue this vicious trend. The homeless crisis in San Francisco continues to be a burden left on only a few neighborhoods, mainly BIPOC/low-mod communities who have little economic or political clout. It is not a responsibility shared by b wealthy supervisory districts such as Pac Heights/Cow Hollow or Sea Cliff Very Trumpian SF is not progressive as you want the world to believe

I am 100% opposed to this proposal for a homeless shelter at 711 Post because our neighbor has been saddled enough. During the past 22 months my community has already added 10 new spaces to house the unhoused made up of 1147 rooms and 2294 beds for an additional 2000 homeless people. I personally spoke to two staff members at two of the supervisor s office and they both noted this would not even be a topic in any other neighborhood besides Bayview or the Mission

Poorly run, deplorable management of existing homeless shelters! Diva Hotel, Navigation Center, and the Granada. This proposal is designed to cram 315 people with 4 grown men sharing 15ft by 15ft room during a pandemic and operated by a group with a lack of experience. How do you get an \$18-milliondollar contract without competitive bids and a lack of experience??!! "Unique and experimental" according to HSH. It is inhumane! As a result, as described by HSH "ex-convicts, sex offenders and mentally ill drug addicts are going to be outside of 711 smoking cigarettes and doing drugs **sandwiched in between two important tourist hotels including the Marriott** 

The Diva Hotel and the Granada both City owned and operated are very very poorly managed and have become drug dens with meth labs drug dealers permanent fixtures on the sidewalks (many with ankle bracelets in plain view) senior citizens and other residents are terrified of unchecked crime rat and roach infestations go unabated. A crime report from Central police station shows this area has had a 56.8% increase in crime in 2021. The first murder of 2021 in Central occurred near the Diva Hotel on the 400 block of Geary with the suspect apprehended on the 700 block of Post Street. December 11 two people were shot on Geary and

Post Hotel at 589 Post Street - 89 rooms 178 beds Hotel Dakota at 606 Post Street - 36 rooms 72 beds Navigation Center at 888 Post Street - 75 beds Halcyon Hotel at 649 Jones Street 27 rooms 54 beds Vertigo Hotel at 940 Sutter Street 110 rooms 220 beds Granada at 1000 Sutter Street 232 rooms 404 bed Vintage Court Hotel on 650 Bush Street - 202 rooms 404 beds Nob Hill Hotel at 835 Hyde Street - 50 rooms 100 beds Monarch Hotel at 1015 Geary Street - 101 rooms 202 beds Diva Hotel 440 Geary - 130 rooms 260 beds Although we have added 2000 additional homeless people, we have not received the benefit of increased City services or increased community support. As a result our streets are trash filled and grimy, sidewalks are littered and smeared with human feces, bushes are dripping with urine, broken crack pipes and used drug needles everywhere, especially Shannon Alley, Croamo Alley, Trader Vic Alley. Please take a walk along Geary from Taylor to Polk I dare you day or night. Where I used to see one drug dealer I see five or six now. Slow or no police response and no mental health outreach or advocacy. I have lived on the 600 block of Post Street two blocks from Union Square for over 25 years and since June 2020 the neighborhood has deteriorated to a constant bombardment of violent mentally ill people and drug addits who are almost naked from the waist down bent over looking for crack crumbs/cigarette butts or shooting up before having sex on the corner of Post and Shannon Alley at 1pm in the afternoon. The City is ruining the quality of life for people in this community who get up and go to work every day a who pay taxes. who contribute positively to society. We now fear for our lives every day as we must navigate drug dealers men masturbating gentals exposed with needles in their arms and people having psychotic engiosdes in the middle of the street day and night. I have unfortunately been an evewitness to all these disturbing events noted above. Slow or no police response even when we call 911.1 am terrified of what my neighborhood has become. May God help us.

Lan STL rain retiniee of what in y legitobricouna stecome. May source in the severely mentally ill I used to love San Francisco. It was a clean vibrant exciting place to live and work. Always on the cutting edge of art music and science. San Francisco is filthy, scary at dusk or dawn, filled with severely mentally ill homeless, hostile drug addicts, very agressive panhandlers, felony assaults, rampant organized retail thefts, burglaries, and drug dealers who operate conspicuously without consequences. A survey in June 2021 by the SF Chamber of Commerce found 80% of the residents queried found crime is getting worst not better. Now I am embarrassed and sad about what SF has become. Do the right thing and vote no Take a stand for a better SF

Dear Aaron:

I hope you're well. I'm writing you today to strongly oppose the proposed shelter at 711 Post Street. I'll put my reasons below.

- Lower Nob Hill is already doing more than their share to help house drug addicts, alcoholics, and the mentally ill with programs at the Granada Hotel, Commodore Hotel, and the navigation center at Post & Hyde, among others.
- Lower Nob Hill is NOT part of the Tenderloin and therefore shouldn't be part of Mayor Breed's state of emergency. (In fact, 711 Post Street is part of the Lower Nob Hill Apartment Hotel Historic District, and the neighborhood needs to be protected.)

- 3. My wife and I have owned a stunning historic resource at 821 Leavenworth for 25 years and we currently have 50% vacancy. It's not that we don't want to rent out our units, it's because thousands of people have left San Francisco because of the pandemic, and no one calls when we put ads on Craigslist or elsewhere.
- Adding more shelters in the area will only drive more people out of town, since that's the other main reason my long-term rent-controlled tenants are leaving. So, by approving this project, <u>you're going against tenants with rent control that</u> <u>the city claims to be protecting</u>.
- 5. The proposed shelter at 711 Post Street will allow drug use on the property, which will inevitably spill over into the neighborhood.
- 6. The whole concept of this being a housing crisis is NONSENSE since no one can possibly rent to these people without losing the rest of their tenants.
- 7. Would you rent an apartment if you knew that you'd be living next to someone who shoots up daily, constantly drinks alcohol, or can't take care of themselves because of mental illness? (Episcopal Community Services is currently trying to recruit landlords in the area to rent out their empty apartments to this group of people.)
- 8. These people need professional help and other neighborhoods outside of the Downtown area and the Mission need to do their share.
- 9. By allowing another shelter in Lower Nob Hill, the city is contributing to urban blight and will only make the current downturn worse.

Please reject this proposal under any circumstances.

Thank you for giving us a three-week opportunity to meet together as a community and hear directly from the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing (HSH) on their proposed 318-bed emergency shelter at 711 Post Street. After reviewing the proposal, there continues to be a significant difference between what is in the grant agreement before the Full Board, and what is appropriately in a contract that will ensure the success of this high-needs facility. In other words: while we appreciate the Administration's attempts to answer some questions, many key details and commitments are still missing.

After rallying over the last two years to bring 451 new units of permanent supportive housing and 75 new shelter beds into our very dense 3-block neighborhood, we have some observations about what is working and what's not. We know that the only way to ensure a successful program is to hold the City accountable to the diverse communities both of existing residents and workers and our unhoused neighbors. That will require infrastructure, investment, contracting transparency and significant staffing & on-site services for the proposed high-needs population. While the Mayor is concerned with keeping campaign promises in press releases, we are the community living with the consequences of neglect and rushed community processes.

Let us be perfectly clear here, The Lower Nob Hill Neighborhood Alliance is in *complete opposition* to the passage of this Grant Agreement #211306 and the installation of the semi-congregate shelter proposed for 711 Post St. in our Lower Nob Hill Neighborhood.

# The Problem:

The Grant Agreement, as proposed, *has nothing* in it that addresses the significant scaling up of shelter operations for 318 people living with trauma and various dual-diagnosis issues. While we appreciated hearing from Urban Alchemy about their street intervention operations, this will be the largest amount of individuals warehoused under their care, which will require a very specific skill-set. Urban Alchemy, which did not go through a competitive bid process but whose \$18m grant agreement was negotiated behind closed doors, does not have the public health/behavioral health qualifications to address the needs of this population - nor a concrete plan to provide them via additional on-site services.

While Urban Alchemy has had some success in "Transforming Energy in Traumatized Urban Space" outside, on the streets of the Tenderloin, they have very little experience with running a complex 318 person crisis center. The first 24-48 hours of treatment are arguably the most crucial to successfully ensuring that clients will remain housed.



*The guests need intensive coordinated care immediately.* That care includes food, clothing, safe shelter, medical care, psychiatric care, drug prevention and addiction treatment 24 hours a day, right away. By definition, this is a population that is in constant need of critical services until they are stabilized. The caretakers, in this case Urban Alchemy, must immediately respond to these needs. While providing a warm bed and a meal will help it does not begin to address the underlying challenges that the guests face every day. Urban Alchemy, as it stands, is not prepared, trained nor capable of providing the intense amount of clinical care that is required during the critical time where unhoused are beginning their journey to stability. This is a risky experiment that our neighborhood and the City cannot afford to take. It is a "quick fix" to an incredibly complex set of issues. We must do this differently.

If this is to be done correctly, holistically, with individualized care and case management, the next step immediately after housing is to provide services that will enable the guests to get back on their feet. Urban Alchemy is ill prepared to offer these critical services. The language in the Grant Agreement speaks for itself.....

# "Assessment: Grantee shall engage, assist, and support all guests to engage with Access Points regarding Problem Solving and Coordinated Entry assessments."

As you can see, the practitioners for Urban Alchemy will be tasked with "engaging, assisting and supporting" those referred to the shelter. What they will not be doing is clinically assessing the needs of the person and immediately and directly connecting them with service providers that can provide care that is crucial when beginning treatment. Those services at minimum should be in the building at the time of the guests' arrival. They will not be.

After a review of the Grant Agreement, it is clear that the City does not have any desire to invest in Urban Alchemy's success, nor to have clinicians present at the point of entry for individuals transitioning off of the streets, who are in desperate need of support from trained staff rendering critical services. The guests are essentially being warehoused in a building with 300+ others to fend for themselves because there is no plan beyond "housing" that the City will actively implement, let alone put in writing.

Thus, the reality is that the Lower Nob Hill Neighborhood will likewise be left to fend for ourselves, to deal with the end result of this failed experiment and we're frankly fed up because we know if this were the Marina, Glen Park, or even on the beautiful Slow Street in front of the Mayor's house, this wouldn't dare be proposed.

# **Proposed Solutions & Asks of Elected Officials:**

This is a half-baked \$18.7m proposal that deserves *much* more scrutiny by the Board of Supervisors and input not only from neighbors but the network of existing community-based service providers with experience across a wide-range of projects citywide. In the Mohammed Nuru-era of contract streamlining for friends, this should not be sole source process but a community discussion on how to ensure the highest level of investment to meet the needs of this vulnerable population. We also know



that our existing neighborhood facilities are struggling, so there is much to learn from the existing gaps in service.

The City and its agencies must have comprehensive plans, with protocols in place **BEFORE** the opening of the facility, with 24/7 case managers on-site. After meeting with HSH we are further convinced that relatively few, if any of our suggestions will be met.

We have drafted a request for amendments to the Grant Agreement, which we ask that the Full Board Members adopt **<u>BEFORE</u>** you finalize this contract:

- Amend Length of Lease Agreement to June 30, 2023. Before spending \$18.7m on a master lease running until June, the operation should be given a chance to deliver some outcomes and be evaluated. If the Board of Supervisors feels the grant agreement objectives are being met, there could be an option to extend an additional year. Ultimately, the community would like to see the City purchase the building.
- **2.** No Human Warehouse: Reduce the Occupancy & Increase Client: Staff Ratio. The number of people housed at the facility should be capped at no more than 150 people to ensure clients are receiving the attention that they need and that the dense hotel is appropriately staffed.
- **3.** Onsite Case Manager(s) should be present 24 hours a day, with at least two CM's at all times, and regular wellness checks should be routinely done.
- 4. On-site support services should be available every day from 7:00am to 7:00pm.
- 5. A Registered Nurse or nursing student in residency should be on staff 24 hrs a day.
- **6.** No weapons allowed. As we watch ambulance after ambulance crowd Post and Sutter Streets, dealing with everything from assaults to regular overdose fatalities at the same city-contracted sites in the neighborhood, it is concerning to know that weapons are being advertised as being acceptable on-site.
- 7. Extend hours and geographic area of community ambassadors at least 4 mobile ambassadors 24/7 from Geary to Pine, and Larkin to Taylor. The Mayor's Office promised this presence at the community meetings surrounding the Lower Polk TAY Navigation Center, and they never materialized, but we understand that this Budget & Finance Committee approved millions from the Mayor to Union Square after looting. Where is the attention to infrastructure for the communities living here, both housed and unhoused?
- 8. Coordinated Investment in Workforce. Agreements from the Mayor's Budget Office and the Office of Economic & Workforce Development (OEWD) for contract support for the length of grant that invests in the community, from our struggling immigrant small business owners hard-hit by the pandemic to our shelter clients in need of workforce development



opportunities. Residents in this working class neighborhood deserve the same attention as Union Square.

- **9.** Coordinated Investment in Infrastructure. This is a very dense residential neighborhood that does not have a Community Benefit District to pick up the slack from a lack of city services. At every single community meeting hosted by the City, the concerns around a lack of street cleaning and even basic amenities like regularly-serviced trash cans, have been a constant. Many residents own dogs and have no parks or open space to walk them in, and there are no trash cans to put dog waste in. Children walking to Redding Elementary School from the Tenderloin regularly walk through human and animal waste, needles and massive amounts of trash. The Mayor must commit to having the Department of Pubic Works (DPW) invest in this neighborhood and stop using it as a dumping ground.
- **10.** Creation of a Community Working Group and oversight committee made up of tenants, homeowners, small businesses, hotel stakeholders, the District Supervisor's office, HSH and shelter providers to meet bi-weekly, then monthly throughout the length of the contract.
- **11. Develop a Coordinated City Response addressing escalating problems** such as drug dealing, fighting, and loitering that has been previously reported to the Task Force but not mitigated. This could include penalties/fines to Facility Operators to closure of the facility.
- **12. Six-month Trial Period.** A probationary period running from July 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 with an evaluation by the Workgroup of data related to calls for service and city response & follow-up.
- **13. Trigger for Facility Closure.** If data reveals a high level of calls in a 6 month period, there should be an escape clause in the grant agreement that allows for another use for the site or another operator to take over. Again, ultimately, we would like to see the site be purchased by the City.
- **14.** Plan for Acquisition of the **711** Post Building. The City's continued reliance on masterleasing is not only financially irresponsible, but also helps the City avoid accountability for the operations they are contracting out. This is a former youth hostel that lends itself well to transitional housing, particularly for young adults who will eventually phase out of the TAY system or families waiting to get into permanent step-up housing opportunities.
- **15. Require Ambassadors to Carry Information Cards.** Our goal is to be able to provide neighbors with an appropriate channel for reporting issues that is not police-based, but also to explain what the Ambassador program is, what they are empowered to do and what the community must do on their own. There should be relevant phone, email, text and website information listed.
- **16.** No Schedule 1 Drugs should be allowed inside the facility that could lead to overdose fatalities.



### These are our asks.

These are all issues that should have been included all along, and they demonstrate all the issues that are going to confront our neighborhood once this facility goes into service. We need thoughtful, well-constructed planning and implementation, not rushed PR strategies and ineffective band-aids. **Until that happens we remain in strict opposition to this project.**

#### Re: Request to oppose 711 Post Street 24/7 Shelter

Dear Supervisor Mar,

I am the General Manager of the Courtyard Union Square hotel located at 761 Post Street and I am writing to you to express my strong opposition to the proposed shelter at 711 Post Street, which will be heard by the Budget Committee on February 2, 2022. This would replace a recently closed youth hostel and I urge you to vote against the proposal. For several reasons, if adopted, this proposal would prove to be catastrophic for the residents, small businesses, and tourist hotels of my neighborhood. In sum, the proposal should be rejected because of the following reasons:

(1) Our neighborhood has already done more than our share in combatting the homelessness crisis by supporting the recent addition of 451 units of permanent supportive housing, the TAY Navigation Center for youth, and a 75-bed homeless shelter, these eleven facilities are all clustered within a small radius of our Lower Nob Hill working class neighborhood. While the city has been focusing on filling beds rather than developing well thought out, well planned, holistic, individualized services and care for unhoused citizens, our beautiful vibrant neighborhood has only gotten worse. The Lower Nob Hill neighborhood has a long history of working closely with the City of San Francisco to help the unhoused, however, we believe this proposed shelter is being rushed through the process at the expense of community outreach and appropriate consideration of impacts.

(2) Adding another 250-bed "no rules" homeless shelter is against the City's policy of geographic equity – Lower Nob Hill has shouldered its fair share and it is time for the city to make good on its promise that other neighborhoods receive a balance of the facilities currently in the pipeline. The plan to open this shelter does not consider an equitable approach to services and in fact is concentrating them into one specific neighborhood that has already seen its quality of life negatively impacted due to recent centers opened in the area. Rushing this shelter through the process is not considerate of the residents and businesses that will be directly impacted.

(3) This huge "no-rules" homeless shelter is the wrong type of shelter for our neighborhood and for its residents – San Francisco's most severely challenged homeless residents need to be permanently housed in small facilities, away from their drug dealers and abusers, with comprehensive on-site services provided by a licensed public health provider, not a nonprofit like Urban Alchemy.

Again, we ask you to not move forward with this project at 711 Post as it is being rushed and is not an equitable approach for a neighborhood that has seen a proliferation of new services already. For all these reasons, the proposed homeless shelter at 711 Post Street would be devastating for this part of Lower Nob Hill as a safe place to live and work. Please vote against the proposed homeless shelter at 711 Post Street.

Good Morning, thank you for the opportunity to speak with you. I am in favor of the HSH's proposal to acquire the property at 711 Post Street for the purpose of creating a semicongregate shelter. There are approximately 5,000 unsheltered individuals living on the streets of San Francisco, 50% of them are senior citizens. We have a very large elderly community living outside. We need to act fairly quickly.

The property at 711 Post Street having previously been a Hostel is perfectly designed to accommodate a semi-congregate shelter. The amenities, the room designs and the kitchen facilities and social spaces are already designed for communal living.

I have a few suggestions that I believe are important to the success of the project. The first suggestion is for 24 hour presence of service providers and the SFPD outside of the shelter to keep the area safe and clean. Because we will be providing services to individuals struggling with addictions and mental health issues. There should also be monthly meetings where the business owners, hoteliers and neighbors are able to provide feedback as to what impacts the New Shelter may be having on their business and/or quality of life.

Also, I have interviewed several members of the Urban Alchemy agency and have been informed that they are not trained to provide mental health or behavioral health services. Because of this, I suggest that there be DPH and Behavioural Health employees located onsite at the new Semi Congregate shelter.

I remain concerned that we still do not know how much the City will be paying per shelter bed per year, nor do we know what the terms and conditions of a potential lease-purchase agreement will be. Approving the Project as proposed is not only fiscally irresponsible, but also exposes the City to significant liability. Further, we do not know where the \$12.6 M in "other revenues" is sourced from. As you know, if those monies come from Federal sources such as CDC or FEMA reimbursements, Federal environmental review is required for alterations to this historical resource."

# STOP THE PROPOSED 711 POST STREET 250-BED "NO RULES" HOMELESS SHELTER

-The Lower Nob Hill Community has done more in the past two years to house and serve San Francisco's homeless population than almost any other neighborhood in the city. •Within a six-block radius in Lower Nob Hill, the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing (DHSH) now operates or has proposed ten facilities that will house the city's homeless population.

# -DHSH now proposes converting an active youth hostel at 711 Post Street into a huge 250-bed experimental shelter.

•The proposed shelter will provide only short-term housing and have **no restrictions on guests' drug use, criminality, or mental status.** No treatment or expulsion rules will exist.

# -We already are afraid to walk our streets and the proposed new shelter will make things much worse.

•With the addition of 250 more residents, we will have over 1200 unhoused "sheltered" within the Lower Nob Hill Community. The concentration of existing homeless shelters added in the last year in Lower Nob Hill has already dramatically and negatively impacted the Lower Nob Hill Community's safety, physical condition, and overall quality of life. The addition of yet another huge new homeless shelter concentrated in such a small geographic area will compound these problems and is not equitable.

# -The proposed new shelter is the wrong kind of shelter.

•The proposed new shelter would not offer permanent or supportive housing. Rather, it would offer short-term housing to some of San Francisco's most chronic homeless residents—many of whom struggle with serious drug addiction and severe mental illness—in a "no rules" setting. DHSH has confirmed they do not plan to exclude from the proposed shelter persons who use illegal drugs in the shelter or persons convicted of violent felonies, sexual assault or even child molestation. They plan to have only 12-hour monitoring for a 24-hour operation and will monitor only the 700 block of Post Street. This type of shelter would threaten the continued viability of Lower Nob Hill as an important pedestrian gateway to Union Square and the theater district and as a working class and middle class community where residents, merchants, workers, students, and patrons feel safe.

-We demand Mayor Breed, the Board of Supervisors, and the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing withdraw the proposal for 711 Post Street and urge the owner to continue to operate the facility as a youth hostel! The City Board of Supervisors will receive the project Mid december and vote the first week of January 2022.

## STOP THE PROPOSED 711 POST STREET 250-BED "NO RULES" HOMELESS SHELTER

-The Lower Nob Hill Community has done more in the past two years to house and serve San Francisco's homeless population than almost any other neighborhood in the city. •Within a six-block radius in Lower Nob Hill, the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing (DHSH) now operates or has proposed ten facilities that will house the city's homeless population.

# -DHSH now proposes converting an active youth hostel at 711 Post Street into a huge 250-bed experimental shelter.

•The proposed shelter will provide only short-term housing and have **no restrictions on guests' drug use, criminality, or mental status.** No treatment or expulsion rules will exist.

# -We already are afraid to walk our streets and the proposed new shelter will make things much worse.

•With the addition of 250 more residents, we will have over 1200 unhoused "sheltered" within the Lower Nob Hill Community. The concentration of existing homeless shelters added in the last year in Lower Nob Hill has already dramatically and negatively impacted the Lower Nob Hill Community's safety, physical condition, and overall quality of life. The addition of yet another huge new homeless shelter concentrated in such a small geographic area will compound these problems and is not equitable.

### -The proposed new shelter is the wrong kind of shelter.

•The proposed new shelter would not offer permanent or supportive housing. Rather, it would offer short-term housing to some of San Francisco's most chronic homeless residents—many of whom struggle with serious drug addiction and severe mental illness—in a "no rules" setting. DHSH has confirmed they do not plan to exclude from the proposed shelter persons who use illegal drugs in the shelter or persons convicted of violent felonies, sexual assault or even child molestation. They plan to have only 12-hour monitoring for a 24-hour operation and will monitor only the 700 block of Post Street. This type of shelter would threaten the continued viability of Lower Nob Hill as an important pedestrian gateway to Union Square and the theater district and as a working class and middle class community where residents, merchants, workers, students, and patrons feel safe.

-We demand Mayor Breed, the Board of Supervisors, and the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing withdraw the proposal for 711 Post Street and urge the owner to continue to operate the facility as a youth hostel! The City Board of Supervisors will receive the project Mid december and vote the first week of January 2022.

This will create an unsafe environment, criminal

element and further strain on the EMS/hospital system. Sounds irresponsible and dangerous to continue permissibility of leading such self destructive behaviors. More rehab and psychiatric intake centers is needed, not approval of no rules shelters."

Chair Haney and Supervisors,

Thank you for giving us a three-week opportunity to meet as a community to hear directly from the Department of Homelessness & Supportive Housing (HSH) on their proposed 318-bed emergency shelter at 711 Post Street. After reviewing the proposals, there continues to be a significant difference between what is in the grant agreement before you in Committee, and what is appropriately in a contract that will ensure the success of this high-needs facility. In other words: while we appreciate the Administration's attempts to answer some questions, many key details and commitments are still missing.

After rallying over the last two years to bring 451 new units of permanent supportive housing and 75 new shelter beds into our very dense 3-block neighborhood, we have some observations about what is working and what is not. We know that the only way to ensure a successful program is to hold the City accountable to the diverse communities both of existing residents/workers and our unhoused neighbors. That will require infrastructure, investment, contracting transparency and significant staffing & on-site services for the proposed high-needs population. While the Mayor is concerned with keeping campaign promises in press releases, we are the community living with the consequences of neglect and rushed community processes.

#### The Problem:

The Grant Agreement, as proposed, *has nothing* in it that addresses the significant scaling up of shelter operations for 318 people living with trauma and various dual-diagnosis issues. While we appreciated hearing from Urban Alchemy about their street intervention operations, this will be the largest number of individuals warehoused under their care, which will require a very specific skill-set. Urban Alchemy, which did not go through a competitive bid process but whose \$18m grant agreement was negotiated behind closed doors, does not have the public health/behavioral health qualifications to address the needs of this population - nor a concrete plan to provide them via additional on-site services.

While Urban Alchemy has had some success in "Transforming Energy in Traumatized Urban Space" outside, on the streets of the Tenderloin, they have very little experience with running a complex 318 person crisis center. The first 24-48 hours of treatment are arguably the most crucial to successfully ensuring that clients will remain housed.



#### The guests need intensive coordinated care immediately.

This is a population that, by definition, is in constant need of critical services until they are stabilized. The caretakers, in this case Urban Alchemy, must immediately respond to these needs. While providing a warm bed and a meal will help, it does not begin to address the underlying challenges that the guests face every day. Urban Alchemy, as it stands, is not prepared, trained nor capable of providing the intense amount of clinical care that is required during the critical time where unhoused are beginning their journey to stability. This is a risky experiment that our neighborhood and the City cannot afford to take. It is a "quick fix" to an incredibly complex set of issues. We must do this differently.

If this is to be done correctly, holistically, with individualized care and case management, the next step after housing is to provide services that will enable the guests to get back on their feet. Urban Alchemy is ill prepared to offer critical services. The language in the Grant Agreement speaks for itself.....

# "Assessment: Grantee shall engage, assist, and support all guests to engage with Access Points regarding Problem Solving and Coordinated Entry assessments."

As you can see, the practitioners for Urban Alchemy will be tasked with "engaging, assisting and supporting" those referred to the shelter. What they will not be doing is clinically assessing the needs of the person and immediately and directly connecting them with services providers that can provide care that is crucial when beginning treatment. Those services at minimum should be in the building at the time of the guests' arrival. They will not be.

After a review of the Grant Agreement, it is clear that the City does not have any desire to invest in Urban Alchemy's success, nor to have clinicians present at the point of entry for individuals transitioning off of the streets, who are in desperate need of support from trained staff rendering critical services. The guests are essentially being warehoused in a building with 300+ others to fend for themselves because there is no plan beyond "housing" that the City will actively implement, let alone put in writing.

Thus, the reality is that the Lower Nob Hill neighborhood will likewise be left to fend for ourselves, to deal with the end result of this failed experiment and we're frankly fed up because we know if this were the Marina, Glen Park, or even on the beautiful Slow Street in front of the Mayor's house, this wouldn't dare be proposed.

#### Proposed Solutions & Asks of Elected Officials:

This is a half-baked \$18.7m proposal that deserves *much* more scrutiny by the Board of Supervisors and input not only from neighbors but the network of existing community-based service providers with experience across a wide-range of projects citywide. In the Mohammed Nuru-era of contract streamlining for friends, this should not be a sole source process but a community discussion on how to ensure the highest level of investment to meet the needs of this vulnerable population and the Lower Nob Hill neighborhood. We also know that our existing neighborhood facilities are struggling, so there is much to learn from the existing gaps in service.

The City and its agencies must have comprehensive plans, with protocols in place BEFORE the opening of the facility, with 24/7 case managers on-site. After meeting with HSH, we have drafted a request for amendments to the Grant Agreement, which we ask that the Budget & Finance Committee members adopt before the Board of Supervisors finalizes the contract:

Neighborhood Alliance

 Amend Length of Lease Agreement to June 30, 2023. Before spending \$18.7m on a master lease running until June, the operation should be given a chance to deliver some outcomes and be evaluated. If the Board of Supervisors feels the grant agreement objectives are being met, there could be an option to extend an additional year. Ultimately, the community would like to see the City purchase the building.

DB HILL

- **2.** No Human Warehouse: Reduce the Occupancy & Increase Client: Staff Ratio. The number of people housed at the facility should be capped at no more than 150 people to ensure clients are receiving the attention that they need and that the dense hotel is appropriately staffed.
- **3.** Onsite Case Manager(s) should be present 24 hours a day, with at least two CM's at all times, and regular wellness checks should be routinely done.
- **4. On-site support services** should be available every day from 7:00am to 7:00pm.
- 5. A Registered Nurse or nursing student in residency should be on staff 24 hrs a day.
- **6.** No weapons allowed. As we watch ambulance after ambulance crowd Post and Sutter Streets, dealing with everything from assaults to regular overdose fatalities at the same city-contracted sites in the neighborhood, it is concerning to know that weapons are being advertised as being acceptable on-site.
- 7. Extend hours and geographic area of community ambassadors at least 4 mobile ambassadors 24/7 from Geary to Pine, and Larkin to Taylor. The Mayor's Office promised this presence at the community meetings surrounding the Lower Polk TAY Navigation Center, and they never materialized, but we understand that this Budget & Finance Committee approved millions from the Mayor to Union Square after looting. Where is the attention to infrastructure for the communities living here, both housed and unhoused?
- 8. Coordinated Investment in Workforce. Agreements from the Mayor's Budget Office and the Office of Economic & Workforce Development (OEWD) for contract support for the length of grant that invests in the community, from our struggling immigrant small business owners hard-hit by the pandemic to our shelter clients in need of workforce development opportunities. Residents in this working class neighborhood deserve the same attention as Union Square.
- **9. Coordinated Investment in Infrastructure.** This is a very dense residential neighborhood that does not have a Community Benefit District to pick up the slack from a lack of city services. At every single community meeting hosted by the City, the concerns around a lack of street cleaning and even basic amenities like regularly-serviced trash cans, have been a constant. Many residents own dogs and have no parks or open space to walk them in, and there are no trash cans to put dog waste in. Children walking to Redding Elementary School from the Tenderloin regularly walk through human and animal waste, needles and massive



amounts of trash. The Mayor must commit to having the Department of Pubic Works (DPW) invest in this neighborhood and stop using it as a dumping ground.

- **10.** Creation of a Community Working Group and oversight committee made up of tenants, homeowners, small businesses, hotel stakeholders, the District Supervisor's office, HSH and shelter providers to meet bi-weekly, then monthly throughout the length of the contract.
- **11. Develop a Coordinated City Response addressing escalating problems** such as drug dealing, fighting, and loitering that has been previously reported to the Task Force but not mitigated. This could include penalties/fines to Facility Operators to closure of the facility.
- **12. Six-month Trial Period.** A probationary period running from July 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 with an evaluation by the Workgroup of data related to calls for service and city response & follow-up.
- **13. Trigger for Facility Closure.** If data reveals a high level of calls in a 6 month period, there should be an escape clause in the grant agreement that allows for another use for the site or another operator to take over. Again, ultimately, we would like to see the site be purchased by the City.
- **14.** Plan for Acquisition of the **711** Post Building. The City's continued reliance on master leasing is not only financially irresponsible, but also helps the City avoid accountability for the operations they are contracting out. This is a former youth hostel that lends itself well to transitional housing, particularly for young adults who will eventually phase out of the TAY system or families waiting to get into permanent step-up housing opportunities.
- **15.** Require Ambassadors to Carry Information Cards. Our goal is to be able to provide neighbors with an appropriate channel for reporting issues that is not police-based, but also to explain what the Ambassador program is, what they are empowered to do and what the community must do on their own. There should be relevant phone, email, text and website information listed.
- **16.** No Class 3 Drugs should be allowed inside the facility that could lead to overdose fatalities.

#### These are our asks.

These are all issues that should have been included all along, and they demonstrate all the issues that are going to confront our neighborhood once this facility goes into service. We need thoughtful, well-constructed planning and implementation, not rushed PR strategies and ineffective band-aids.

Dear Supervisor Haney

What do you want for the city? Remember the plan for Market Street? A wide boulevard, running diagonally through our bustling downtown, closed to traffic save public transport. A place to stroll, shop, eat?

I walk the city. I am a long time resident and lucky. I am 78, healthy, considering, married for generations to a man I love and laugh with. We volunteer delivering food twice a week with FoodRunners and are long time Glide members and kitchen help.

We love living on Post Street where it is flat, relatively, and we can get everything we want without enlisting Amazon.

Since the pandemic our neighborhood, always urban, has become threatening. Drug use has come out of the alleys and people's behavior has become more erratic, our streets are filthy.

It seems like everything we ignore builds upon itself. The disappearance of garbage cans and the trash on the streets, then the graffiti, the people sprawled on the sidewalk, then people openly using drugs, then people ranting and threatening. A call to 311 seems almost comical.

So two days before Thanksgiving, when we received the notice about the new shelter a block away from our apartment, we took notice. We had attended the meeting about the TAY and were strongly in favor of having young adults receive the help they needed to improve their lives. This shelter sounded different and alarming.

And we were right to be concerned. This was a different type of housing. And it was put forth in a very different way. The holidays shut our already pandemic limited access to the government employees we needed to contact. The little information we could glean sounded like this was a poorly planned project that

would warehouse some of our most anguished neighbors, packing them into a building that is unsafe, unsuitable and under-supervised.

And so it is. And now it goes before you and you have to decide if this is what you want for San Francisco. The Mayor said about the drug use outside the new Linkage Center on Market Street... that looks less and less stroll-able..."We cannot control who does or does not use drugs in any given location,"

What do you want for this city? Our Lower Nob Hill community, one of the only working class affordable neighborhoods left in San Francisco, will vanish if a rotating group of 300 plus suffering souls are dumped on our streets. We can't absorb any more suffering.

11 facilities housing our unsheltered neighbors have appeared in our small downtown neighborhood in the last three years. We really have enough.

Please see a city where there is room for us too. Please vote against the shelter at 711 Post Street.

I understand that the Urban Alchemy proposal is to convert 711 Post to a no rules, no services "shelter" for 250 of our most troubled homeless. The Urban Alchemy plan will not work. #### Supervisors,

My husband and I have lived in Lower Nob Hill for over 14 years, specifically, the Tendernob. I am also a 20-year small business owner in Union Square. It's always been a neighborhood in need of improvements and has at times struggled to cope with a myriad of issues that don't have quick solutions including homelessness, violence, graffiti, drug use, and crime. However, over the course of the last several years, this neighborhood has gone from feeling somewhat neglected by the city to now *completely ignored*—and we're all suffering because of it. Beyond public trash cans being removed and never replaced, the street itself torn up and never repaired, and broken and run-down bus stops that are never repaired, now, the lack of attention we've been getting has transcended from annoying to dangerous.

It is undeniable that there is a direct correlation between the rapid demise in the quality of life in our neighborhood and the high concentration of mismanaged services that the city has decided to locate within a 2-block radius of where we live:

The Granada, 1000 Sutter Street

The Hotel Vertigo, 940 Sutter Street

- Lower Polk TAY Navigation Center, 700 Hyde Street
- Hyde Street Community Services, 815 Hyde Street

Please understand that this is not a NIMBY letter. As citizens of San Francisco, we think that it is entirely reasonable for all neighborhoods to have supportive services for our homeless community, and the TenderNob–our back yard–shouldn't be an exception. And while we welcome the services and residents with open arms, we do expect that the neighborhood is respected, and the city takes accountability for the property they are running. It is simply unfair to provide services to a handful of citizens in need at the detriment to the entire neighborhood.

The mismanagement of these facilities is quite obvious to anyone who lives near one, and something that desperately needs to be resolved prior to adding yet **another homeless shelter in our neighborhood at 711 Post Street**. While we think four of these services in such concentration is simply bad city planning, adding a 5th would be disastrous if that property is mismanaged like the others listed above.

#### The Hotel Vertigo - SIP

We have always been a strong supporter of getting our community's homeless populations the help they

deserve and need. Especially during the pandemic, when our homeless population was at its most vulnerable, the City of San Francisco needed to step in. We think the SIP hotel idea was a stroke of genius that not only supported the guests who were housed there but also supported the hotel itself and other local businesses that supply the food, security, laundry, and other services.

The Hotel Vertigo is 74 feet from where we live–and it bears repeating–we do not have an issue with the location. But The Hotel Vertigo, managed by the city of San Francisco and Urban Alchemy is an embarrassment and a travesty:

#### Garbage

Prior to turning into a SIP hotel, this location was never a problem when it came to waste management. Now, garbage is a recurring issue. The streets have never been more disgusting. Utensils, food, and food containers from the hotel foodservice are scattered on the sidewalks, bus stops, and on the steps to our apartment on a daily basis. What appears to be the belongings of evicted tenants can frequently be found on the sidewalks. Broken glass, used needles, human feces and used condoms are now daily reminders that we live next to a mismanaged SIP.

Additionally, as 'landlords', you are in violation of your own laws surrounding recycling and composting that we as residents embrace and work hard to adhere to. Food is not being composted, and black garbage bins are always stuffed with recyclables. You've been a supporter of Zero Waste initiatives in the past, yet this city-run property is in violation of local ordinances with seemingly zero enforcement.

### **Resident Loitering**

Residents of the Hotel are frequently gathered on the sidewalks where they are tearing apart bicycles and electric scooters, sleeping, fighting, playing loud music, and openly doing drugs. Especially after dark, this has made most of us feel very unsafe walking back to our apartments. We're not going out after dark, and unfortunately, that means our neighborhood small businesses suffer.

#### **Vehicle Loitering**

The hotel has attracted a steady stream of vehicles that are parked around our neighborhood that are:

Parked illegally - often blocking access to fire hydrants

- Blatantly consuming alcohol while operating a vehicle
- Selling stolen goods out of trunks
- Playing music loud enough to rattle building windows
- Dumping trash in the streets and sidewalk

### Security

The Security Service employed seems to be doing nothing to prevent any of this. In fact, we frequently witness one particular guard getting high at surrounding area bus stops before returning to work.

### Property at 711 Post

To be clear, we are strongly against this property being converted into a 123 unit homeless shelter. Particularly since San Francisco will be awarding the management contract to the same company managing the Vertigo Hotel. Unless you can assure our neighborhood that we will see no increase in unlawful activity, this project needs to be halted. Or else, you are effectively turning Lower Nob Hill into an expansion of the Tenderloin that we fear it will never recover from.

I am writing to you today to sincerely urge you put a temporary hold on the proposed Homeless Shelter at 711 Post Street in order give us residents time to assess the impact the hotel conversion will have on our fragile neighborhood. I have been a homeowner in the 600 block of Post Street for over 25 years and have invested a tremendous amount of time, energy, and money in trying to make Lower Nob Hill a safe and vibrant community. The recent rushed announcement of the hotel conversion at 711 Post Street was a kick in the teeth to me and the other members of our community who have had to endure tremendous hardships due to Covid-19 and the City-wide shutdown.

Our neighborhood has already done more than our fair share in combatting the homelessness crisis by supporting the recent addition of 451 units of permanent supportive housing and a 75-bed homeless shelter, all clustered within a small radius of our Lower Nob Hill working class neighborhood. Adding another 250-bed "no rules" homeless shelter flies in the face of the City's policy of geographic equity – Lower Nob Hill has shouldered its fair share and it is time for the City to make good on its promise that other neighborhoods receive a balance of the facilities currently in the pipeline.

It is important for the Supervisors of the Board to hear how the City's disinvestment and disregard for the neighborhood have dramatically impacted everyone, from parents walking their kids to school to seniors trying to attend medical appointments to hotel and wait staff afraid to go to work. The Mayor, the Department of Homelessness, the Department of Public Health, the Office of Economic & Workforce Development, and the Department of Public Works have all failed to deliver on their promises at previous community meetings to solicit our support that they would increase services and facilities. We were promised well-run professional supportive housing programs, adequate street cleaning, and community foot patrols. We were promised we'd be treated like a *real* neighborhood, with investment and City collaboration. Instead, we've watched the neighborhood deteriorate even further – for our housed and unhoused residents.

I thank you in advance for taking this issue into consideration and look forward to your putting the brakes on this matter on Wednesday's scheduled Budget Committee meeting.

I'm opposed to 711 Post Street proposal because:

(1) Our neighborhood has already done more than our share in combating the homelessness crisis by supporting the recent addition of 451 units of permanent supportive housing and a 75-bed homeless shelter, all clustered within a small radius of our Lower Nob Hill working class neighborhood. Our longtime residents and small businesses championed solutions to a problem that has only gotten worse, as the City has failed repeatedly to deliver on its promises to ensure the success of these programs; and

(2) adding another 250-bed "no rules" homeless shelter flies in the face of the City's policy of geographic equity – Lower Nob Hill has shouldered its fair share and it is time for the City to make good on its promise that other neighborhoods receive a balance of the facilities currently in the pipeline; and

(3) this huge "no-rules" homeless shelter is the wrong type of shelter for our neighborhood and for its residents – San Francisco's most severely challenged homeless residents need to be permanently housed in small facilities, away from their drug dealers and abusers, with comprehensive on-site services provided by a licensed public health provider, not an unqualified nonprofit like Urban Alchemy; and

(4) the City's "community outreach" on this proposal has been a disgrace – announcing the proposal Thanksgiving weekend with a vote already scheduled for the Wednesday right after the holidays. If this were the Mayor's neighborhood, or the Marina or Forest Hills, the neighborhood would never have been treated with this inequity. We are renters, families, seniors, workers, teachers and artists. We demand as a community to be respected and to be heard!

5. Urban Alchemy is unprepared to operate the facility. I have searched the website for information and I have not found any evidence to suggest that Urban Alchemy has any experience, let alone expertise, in residential building operations in San Francisco. Similarly, Urban Alchemy has no reported food service expertise. The recipient of a 18M grant of public funds should promise more than cleaning trash from the sidewalk outside the facility and respectful dialogue with residents in distress. Homeless resources are not unlimited. The Department of Housing & Homelessness proposed five year financial commitment to an unproven organization makes no sense.

6. **The homeless in distress need better care.** Ms. Cohen and the representatives of Urban Alchemy were clear that 711 Post is intended to house our most severely challenged homeless. However, equally clear was the intention that the building serve as a no rules shelter. She stated that open on-premise drug use would not disqualify a resident. It is apparent that Urban Alchemy was selected because it promised that both sides of the 700 block of Post (for 12 hours per day) would be cleared of 711 residents. The apparent objective is to shift those at risk of overdose and the severely disturbed out of sight. Urban Alchemy staff members are not licensed and qualified public health professionals. Our acute homeless need help and well-run professional supportive housing. I urge you to aspire to more than simply warehousing our people in distress out of sight.

There is no way the Supervisors or the Mayor could know the horror show our neighborhood has become. In the last year, we are 180 degrees different. This neighborhood is working class. Its vital and strategic to a healthy downtown. Lower Nob Hill is all ethnicities, very diverse with the best core of small business and restaurants in San Francisco. This plan will gut us. We are old, young, all races and every gender. You don't move into this neighborhood if you're uncomfortable with diversity, so I throw back the shade intentionally tossed at us by Urban Alchemy, who know nothing about our neighborhood, not even our name, and who declare we object because we fear diversity. The reality is crime is a tsunami now and the city's plans and UA work does nothing to address it.

If your plans don't include drug and medical treatment, which 711 Post does not, then you are magical thinking. Placing 250 to 318 mostly men, in one building with one kitchen with no rules, no fulltime skilled medical care and no law enforcement is not an Experiment. It is a crime that we will watch unfold in real time. Not only to the Meth addicted and the newly released felons who you plan to house at 711 Post, but to this neighborhood.

You are giving 711 Post the hardest of the hardened, and the worst of the worst harmed who come here from the whole country. While offering nothing more than cigarette butt sweeping and a vest wearing UA security guard at the door and on the corner. I'm in the Tenderloin every day. I see how UA shuffles people away from the corners and businesses who employ them, but the problems are still there, right across the street or shuffled down the block. That's what this 18 million will pay for on our block. Maybe 700 feet of clear sidewalk and then crime and poverty just beyond. You are magical Thinking if you have faith in this experiment. Dear Chair Haney and Supervisors Safaí and Mar,

I am writing on behalf of UNITE HERE Local 2's 13,000 members to request a continuance of Item 9 on the January 5, 2022 Budget and Finance Committee calendar.

Many Local 2 members are longtime residents of the Lower Polk/Nob Hill and Greater Tenderloin neighborhoods and many work in those neighborhoods, which comprise the heart of the City's recovering tourism industry. It is the densest neighborhood west of Manhattan, and working in partnership with the District 3 office, the community has recently supported the addition of 451 units of permanent supportive housing and a new 75 bed Navigation Center all within the same four block radius. We have been proud champions of solutions to homelessness, and have eagerly awaited the City's followthrough on its previous commitments to "geographic equity". Our office on Golden Gate Avenue was one of the lead organizers of the grassroots "Four Corner Friday" project, where community stakeholders worked together to address public safety issues and street conditions through positive activation and service coordination. In short, we've been at the heart of proactive and progressive policy organizing for many years.

The Mayor's proposal to fast-track a 250-318 bed facility within a block of the TAY Navigation Center and other permanent supportive housing facilities still struggling to get promised city investment is very concerning to our members. It's also concerning that the extremely challenging population proposed for the facility clearly needs specific support from a licensed public health and housing provider, of which the proposed grantee is not. Perhaps most concerning though is the lack of community process.

This is a diverse working-class community that deserves to have input into a plan that will have a dramatic impact on the fabric of the neighborhood. 75% of Local 2 members are

My name is Ian Bevilacqua and I am the President of the Lower Nob Hill Neighborhood Alliance. I have been a resident of San Francisco for 22 years and have lived on the 600 block of Post Street in Lower Nob Hill for the past 11 years. I am writing to you on behalf of the Lower Nob Hill Neighborhood Alliance to express our strong opposition to the proposed shelter at 711 Post Street, which would replace a recently closed youth hostel, and to urge you to vote against the proposal. For the following reasons, if adopted, this proposal would prove to be catastrophic for the residents, small businesses, and tourist hotels of our neighborhood.

Instead, we've watched the neighborhood deteriorate even further – for our housed and unhoused residents.

We know that you are seeking to represent Lower Nob Hill in the California Assembly. We are looking for a representative who understands our economically and socially diverse historically-significant neighborhood. We need a representative who will seek our input and collaborate with us to further the interests of the residents, workers, and merchants of Lower Nob Hill.

### **Dear Supervisors**

Please vote against or vote to postpone the approval of the experimental, no rules shelter replacing the Youth Hostel at 711 Post Street. The neighbors are against the project. We only learned of the project two days before Thanksgiving. And you are voting on Wednesday January 5th! There is no notice posted on the building. Meetings were held so quickly few of us could organize to attend. But we are organizing. We are circulating a petition. We have created a neighborhood organization. Please give us the time to be heard!!!

Lower Nob Hill already is home to 526 units of supportive housing plus a 75 bed TAY shelter. We are doing our share. We are an area of historic apartment buildings and hotels that offer an affordable range of accommodations in our city that is often criticized for being outlandishly expensive. Please don't implode our community. Our streets are already unsafe and unclean.

And the shelter being proposed at 711 Post is the most difficult type for a community to host. We are told the guest population would change continually, only be in residence until a placement is determined. Guests would be recently released from incarceration, hospitalization and the most challenged people living on our streets. The group holding the lease for the shelter is Urban Alchemy. The Urban Alchemy representative told us that there are no restrictions. None limiting guests entrance and egress, none limiting their drug use. Guests will be asked to check their weapons at the door. Guests that wish to smoke or to walk are free to roam the neighborhood and the Tenderloin. This shelter is right between two struggling tourist hotels and across from small restaurants, some of which have just spent precious resources on building Parklets with outdoor seating. The shelter will be tragic for our struggling working class Lower Nob Hill community.

711 Post is being run under the auspicious of Urban Alchemy. Urban Alchemy is being awarded an 18 million plus no bid contract. Urban Alchemy has no experience that I could discern running a residential building, providing food service or the treatment vital to the urgent needs of its guests.

Please vote against the 711 Post Street project. It will harm our community. We have not had the time to organize our neighborhood response. 711 Post Street project will not benefit the guests, placing them in an unsupervised situation, close to the conditions that they are trying to escape, with no supportive programs or treatment. Giving Urban Alchemy over 18 million is suspect. Please vote against or vote to postpone the vote on this project.
