A.1. Survey Area

This application is for the purpose of conducting an historic, cultural and architectural resource survey of the part of San Francisco historically known as North Beach. Geographically, North Beach is essentially a valley lodged between Russian and Telegraph Hills. It is proposed that the survey area follow the boundaries shown on the attached map. This choice was made after consulting a participant of the Chinatown Cultural, Historical Resources Survey, the San Francisco Dept. of City Planning, and others who might be knowledgeable about or concerned with the area. Suggestions led to the decision to make the boundaries congruent with census tracts so that these resource findings can be used to complement simultaneous social planning efforts for the area.

A.2. Special Characteristics of North Beach

Although many parts of North Beach were originally settled by Irish-Americans and most recently by Chinese-Americans, North Beach is best known as the traditional home of Italian-American life in the Bay Area. This status is of considerable importance to this survey. Historians who gathered to discuss the survey in mid-August 1980 agreed that there has been no formal recognition of the Italian-American contribution to San Francisco and Northern California. This survey could provide an exciting opportunity to document social use of buildings and space that reveal a philosophy of living both historically and today. Even casual visitors are aware of the distinctive, cosmopolitan rhythms of the area.

The patterns of building ownership were, and continue to be, familial, so the architectural section of this survey will tell much about the social and economic history of its peoples.

Several buildings housed distinctive institutions, although surprisingly only three have been designated as landmarks. Among those not so designated is the Bank of Italy. Known to most people as the parent of one of the largest banks in the world, for many Italian-Americans, the important remembrance is that the founder, Giannini, "enabled working men to become owners of property by lending money on the strength and skill of their hands." Similar social concern was exhibited by the successful businessman, Fugazi, who donated the money in 1913 for the building that bears his name. A fine theater, in need of restoration, is in this building, along with offices of the Italian Welfare Agency. For sixty years, the Italian-American community supported needy members solely from private contributions. A preliminary site visit by a member of the San Francisco Landmarks Preservation Advisory Board indicates that the Fugazi Building, the Bank of Italy, and several others may be worthy of landmark status.

A further opportunity presented by this survey would be to elucidate the historical exchange with neighboring Chinatown. Philip Choy, the architect and historian who is participating in the 1980 Architectural and Cultural Resource Survey of Chinatown, has described interesting commerce between Chinese-American and Italian-American merchants, especially along Broadway. In the early part of this period, the 1920s and 1930s, business relationships tended to develop along boundaries of residential areas.

Audio-visual presentations to the community of this unfamiliar bit of history could contribute greatly to the new condition of shared business and residential space in North Beach.

As a cityscape, North Beach has unusual merit. There is a pleasing, very practical combination of scale and space. A variety of people gather in and move through these spaces at all hours of the day and night. Within a compact area there is a whole small city, complete with theaters, delicatessens, restaurants, professional offices, specialty shops, corner groceries, churches, fraternal and benevolent organizations. The area also includes the foundations of the Bijou, which survived the earthquake because it was built underground. Long forgotten, the Bijou was recently discovered under the sidewalk.

Residential areas fan out behind either side of Columbus Avenue, which runs diagonally through the survey area to connect North Beach with Fisherman's Wharf and the Downtown. Strong focal points are provided in the vista along Columbus Avenue to the Transamerica Pyramid Building and across the greenward of Washington Park to the handsome Church of Saints Peter and Paul.

General features of the area are described by urban and architectural historian, Randolph Delehanty: "the area has a wonderful urban fabric, and some of the better examples in San Francisco of post-1906 buildings." "North Beach is also an ideal place to experience the social essence of San Francisco, the great variety of her population, and the relative civility with which people treat one another." (R. Delehanty, San Francisco, Walks & Tours in the Golden Gate City)

#### A.3. Cultural Resources

Buildings, historical documents, oral histories, photographs of historical interest, and the often overlooked invaluable resource of letters will be among the resources examined. With every passing year, opportunities disappear to record the memories of San Franciscans who came to North Beach in the early days. Their importance is not only in recollecting customs, but also facts about buildings and building uses that cannot be traced from written sources. The detail and vividness of the oral contribution could enhance the cultural and archival history of the architectural fabric immeasurably. It is extremely important that this be recorded before all chance is lost.

One set of definitions employed would be the criteria for landmarks designation by the City of San Francisco: individual buildings of landmark quality and parts of the urban fabric which meet the criteria for historic districts. It is hoped that this systematic approach will yield not only buildings that are noteworthy, but also produce interesting information for presentation on plaques on a wide variety of buildings. Educating residents and visitors to the history of the area is a prime objective of this survey.

#### A.4. Time Span

The survey will cover the earliest days when the term, North Beach, was first used to the present. Resources from all periods will be examined.

#### B.1. Survey Tasks and Schedule

##### (a) November 1, 1980 - January 15, 1981

Community Awareness Program: initial audio-visual presentation overview and special points that demonstrate the cosmopolitan nature of the area.

Prepare base maps of survey areas.

Recruit volunteers.

Develop objectives and priorities.

##### (b) January 16, 1981 - February 15, 1981

Overview, preliminary and on-the-job training of Research Assistants. Preliminary evaluation and transfer of data to State Historic Resources Inventory Forms.

Training will adhere to rigorous professional standards as the end uses of this survey will be for educational, technical and community purposes. The orientation, background and accomplishments of the trainers are outstanding. Trainers will draw upon extensive experience in other surveys and use the most effective approaches for the particular emphasis of this survey area.

Evaluation of sample data and transfer and data to State Historic Resources Inventory Forms, so that procedure can be worked out for large scale evaluation later.

(c) February 16, 1981 - July 1, 1981

Collect historic, cultural and architectural data, including archival and photographic.

Community Awareness Program: prepare and present two progress reports to community through audio-visuals; emphasize survey discoveries around themes of interest to the community.

Publish booklet.

(d) July 2, 1981 - July 31, 1981

Evaluate and transfer data to State Historic Resources Inventory Forms; include recommendations to S.F. Landmarks Preservation Advisory Board.

(e) August 1, 1981 - September 15, 1981

Continue survey to cover anything overlooked earlier. Begin preparation of first publication materials. Choose subjects for high quality photographic treatment in final publication.

(f) September 16, 1981 - November 1, 1981

Prepare draft and final edition of survey publication.

Community Awareness Program: mount display in appropriate spots as museums, libraries.

Conduct community educational event.

B.2. (a) Community Participation

Community participation is essential to this survey. Every effort will be made to draw upon the living memory bank of Chinese-Americans and Italian-Americans of North Beach. Exciting material has emerged during the preparation of this application, and most who have learned about the survey are delighted at the opportunities it presents.

At the operational level, there will be concerted, systematic effort to consult with and include all community organizations. It is recognized that the Chinatown Neighborhood Improvement Association has valuable experience from conducting a similar survey in the core of Chinatown.

(b) Experts

San Francisco is fortunate in possessing many people with notable experience in surveys of urban, cultural and architectural resources. A few will be engaged as paid consultants, when necessary, but it is hoped that many will have the time and interest to assist in limited but critical ways as the project progresses. Those who have been contacted and have endorsed the survey and pledged support include: Jeremy Kotas, Planner in the San Francisco Dept. of City Planning; Philip Choy, Consultant to the Architectural and Cultural Resources Survey of Chinatown, and member of the San Francisco Landmarks Preservation Advisory Board; Randolph Delehanty, urban and architectural historian, evaluator for Splendid Survivors and author of San Francisco, Walks & Tours in the Golden Gate City; Jean Kortum, historian and

NOTE: The Survey Coordinator assumes responsibility for raising additional funds from non-state sources as required.

D.1. Results, Planning and National Register

- (a) Data for city landmarks designations. Between 1968 and July 1, 1980, 120 buildings were designated as landmarks in San Francisco. Only three are in North Beach. There is considerable official interest in improving this record.
- (b) National Register Nominations: eligibility will be determined. The National Register program and associated tax benefits will be featured in public presentations.
- (c) All possibilities for rehabilitation loan programs, local, state, and federal, will be explored. Financing information will be disseminated, with guidelines to sensitivity to original forms.
- (d) Environmental review. The survey will provide the data necessary to enable the City and other public agencies to better evaluate the impact of discretionary actions on cultural resources pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act, the National Environmental Policy Act and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.
- (e) Finally, it is expected that the survey will stimulate investment interest by merchants, professionals and others in revitalization through preservation and restoration. Private efforts in 1979-80 are already stimulating such interest in neighboring premises.

D.2. Publications and Educational Efforts

Publications will include: one booklet midway through the survey; reference pamphlets; a Technical Report with State Historical Resources Inventory Forms for sale to the public; a book with text on urban, cultural, historical and architectural findings, plus description of survey, and fine quality photographs for sale through bookstores. (Additional money will be raised to meet this last publication objective.)

Public education is a principal purpose of this survey. This will be accomplished through presentations to all types of organizations in North Beach, core of Chinatown, and other parts of San Francisco.

The evaluations on the map and accompanying list of architecturally and historically significant properties in the North Beach Neighborhood Commercial District are taken from a survey of a larger area done by the North Beach Historical Project, Inc. Following an initial visual evaluation of some buildings by Randolph Delehanty, various field surveyors completed evaluations for the remainder of the area. Subsequently, additional research identified a number of buildings worthy of individual recognition on State Historical Resource Inventory Forms.

Without altering the criteria used by the North Beach Historical Project, Heritage has reviewed the evaluations for consistency and added its own evaluations to some areas south of Broadway which were not covered previously.

The ratings are as follows:
