The matter of the slow street program is more than just a petty neighborhood squabble. While the Lake slow street was initially welcomed in the first month or so of the pandemic in March of 2020, it is now redundant, dangerous and burdensome to those who live on and near it. Lake must be opened immediately.

The initiation of the slow street program which was pitched as a temporary program, is nothing short of an illegal overreach on behalf of the SFMTA to start a systematic permanent closure of public streets that it could not do legally. Even under newly enacted AB773, the initiation of any slow street program requires an ordinance which can only be granted by the BOS and only after 6 elements of the legislation are achieved. Additionally, SFMTA was warned by then City Attorney, Dennis Herrera, not to proceed with the program before an EIR was completed. They still have yet to complete one.

Over 1100 and counting of your constituents on the west side of the city are prepared to litigate this wrongdoing because the slow streets are simply not working for the majority of people who live in SF, now that the city and schools are back open. But even if they were working, the illegal way in which they came to be cannot be tolerated. We all must remain vigilant to the subtle ways our democracy is eroding through apathy and disregard for the law. If SFMTA wants to initiate a slow street program you must demand that it do so transparently, democratically and legally. If, after that, the community feedback and process results in Lake remaining a slow street I will accept that because that is how the democratic process works.

Additionally, Lake street is next to Mountain Lake Park and the Presidio making Lake slow street redundant. It is a needed major artery with no cross-traffic that has not had a fatality on it in over 15 years. It keeps nearly 20,000 vehicles per day from driving through our local surface streets with intersections and pedestrians at every corner. All night long it is used by big rigs and trucks. People do not drive less because their most efficient routes to get them to their destinations faster are blocked and closed. Instead, they are on the roads longer, emitting more carbon emissions from stopping and going, and in the case of the Great Highway, they're right next to homes instead of bypassing the City on a distant coastal scenic route. The Great Highway's closure has gone from being a temporary additional place to be socially distant to a nonstop effort to permanently close and commercialize this quiet 2-mile stretch of road with sand dunes that are a National Wildlife Sanctuary along a pristine beach. It already has a multi-use path that is 16' wide when maintained with ample room for all to share the space, but that fact holds no weight with those looking to keep it closed forever.

Closing streets to vehicles and removing needed parking are of no value to anyone; diverting traffic only causes congestion elsewhere. Very few of San Francisco's citizens living on the western end of town can function without a vehicle or are in need of a wider sidewalk or bike path. We need better street maintenance and a first-class transportation system to be able to drive less, and we have neither.
