

## Dr. Toye Moses



Dr. Toye Moses retired in 2016 after 24 years as Executive Director of the Southeast Community Facility Commission (SCFC).

A San Francisco resident since 1974, Dr. Moses has been an active member of the Bayview community and has received numerous awards and commendations for his public service leadership in civic and political arenas.

He has served on the Immigrant Rights Commission, and currently the Juvenile Probation Commission.

He holds a Ph. D. and a Master's Degree in public health and used his knowledge to serve those who need it the most. Before joining SCFC he was a mental health provider with Forensic Jail Psychiatric Services at the San Francisco County Jail, directed the Young Community Developers, empowering disenfranchised youth and the Liberation House, serving recovering alcoholics and drug abusers.

Originally from Nigeria, Dr. Moses came to the United States in 1965. He attended University of Colorado, Fisk University and San Jose State University, University of San Francisco and California College of Podiatry Medicine.

He is the president and cofounder of the Willie B. Kennedy Democratic Club, president and a co-founder of the African American Democratic Club; and president-elect 2016/17 of the Rotary Club of San Francisco Bayview. He also serves on the San Francisco NAACP Executive Board Committee, Black Leadership Forum, San Francisco Planning and Urban Research Advisory Board.
