

# Groundwater Storage and Recovery Project – License to Enter and Use Property

#### **Project Background**

 The SFPUC approved implementation of the Regional Groundwater Storage and Recovery Project ("RGSR Project") on August 12, 2014

- The project is based on in-lieu storage of groundwater
- The RGSR project is part of the Water System Improvement Project and would allow SFPUC jointly manage the south westside groundwater basin




# **Project Background Continued**


- The project provides a new dry-year groundwater supply, increases dry-year capacity and water supply reliability
- The project will also provide drinking water for emergency supply in the event of an earthquake or other major catastrophe

 Project operation will require Daly City to operate two project wells that will deliver groundwater to its Westlake Pump Station



# **Location of Project Project Wells**









### **Project Operation**

- RGSR agreement involves partner agencies
  - San Bruno
  - Cal Water (South San Francisco)
  - Daly City
- During normal and wet years, SFPUC provides additional regional system water to the partners
  - This allows them to pump less groundwater and increase storage in the basin
- During dry years project wells and partner wells pump at capacity



### **License to Enter and Use Property**

- Two project wells were constructed in Daly City
  - Park Plaza Well
  - Ben Franklin Well
- Both wells connect to Daly City's Westlake Pump Station
- RGSR operating agreement requires Daly City to operate these two project wells
- This License Agreement would Authorize Daly City to operate and maintain these Wells
