Working together to serve residents of San Francisco




Commitment to Safety

- PG&E's most important stand: everyone and everything is always safe
- Consistency benefits all parties
 - One set of rules
 - Standards are critical to safety



Reliability

- In 2005, PG&E committed to 100 reliability projects in San Francisco to close power plants
- San Francisco has lowest average frequency and shortest duration of outages in the PG&E service territory



Minutes out of power for average SF customer for entire calendar year



Investment

- \$2 billion in the last 15 years into the electric & gas systems
- Investing \$1 billion in the next five years
 - Transmission projects and substation rebuilds kicking off this year to increase reliability, redundancy and emergency preparedness



San Francisco Partnership

- PG&E prioritizes critical CCSF projects
 - Affordable housing, schools, hospitals, parks

Weekly meeting between PG&E and SFPUC engineers

 Monthly meetings with PG&E and City Department teams to coordinate on priorities



Wholesale vs Retail

- PG&E respects San Francisco's right to provide service
- With rights comes obligations a commitment to safety
- Wholesale service more limited options than retail
