Schedule Impacts:

- Point of connection dispute
- Service Agreement delay
- PG&E design review, design exemptions review
- PG&E field inspections, power connections (fire season)

ROSSI POOL: 600A 120/208V 125 kVA

COST IMACT: \$668K

SCHEDULE IMPACT: 126 days

Shutdown for like-for-like replacement with Meter & CT replacement

Schedule Impacts:

- Service Agreement delay
- Extended CM oversight
- Time extension change orders
- Critical path impact, delayed opening

RPD Average Construction Overhead Costs

Contractor Extended Overhead: \$3,600-\$5,600/day Construction Management& Project Management & Construction Administration Weekly Low: \$15,000 High: \$42,000

PG&E's Unnecessary Project Requirements

- Tie in locations blocks away
- Additional equipment for low-side metering

CURRENT: WDT3 – Primary Service requirement

Unnecessary Delay

- Dispute over requirements
- Delayed service agreements
- Delayed design and waiver reviews
- Delayed inspections
- Delayed connections


Cost Impacts

- Contractor extended overhead
- Extended CM/PM/CA
- Unnecessary requirements
 - Interrupter and transformer for low-side metering

Facility Size Space Comparison










Unnecessary Primary Switchgear-permanently removes recreation space




9th & Lincoln Gateway Project – Golden Gate Park



Phase: Design, est. bid Q3 2022

Scope of work: move existing meter 10'


PG&E requires new primary service under WDT3. The project as envisioned is infeasible unless a waiver is granted for meter relocation without primary.





No change in demand; primary service not necessary

Gene Friend Rec Center-SoMa



Phase: Design, Construction Start Q2 2023

Status: application for primary service has been submitted to PG&E in order to move project forward under current WDT3 agreement

Load: 348kW

Impacts: Unnecessary Primary service

- ~\$1M+ cost
- space required for primary service displaces trash storage or vehicular service and active recreation space



Herz Recreation Center-McLaren Park



Phase: Design, bid Q3 2022

Status: application for primary service has been submitted to PG&E in order to move project forward under current WDT3 agreement

Load: 253 kVa

Impact: Unnecessary Primary service


- + \$500-750,000 cost
- space required for primary service required loss of all on-site staff parking, an ADA parking space, and maintenance shed

Risks:

- Project Delay: Service Agreement, Design Review, Field Inspections, Final Connections
- Financial Impacts of Delay







Transbay Parcel 3 – new park, East Cut



Phase: Design

Status: project team is requesting a waiver from WDT3/ delivery of secondary service via retail agreement with PG&E.

Scope: small restroom building

Risks:

- Waiver is denied and unnecessary primary service required
 - + \$500-750,000
 - Permanent loss of 720sf of park space
- Project Delay: Service Agreement, Design Review, Field Inspections, Final Connections
- Financial Impacts of Delay





primary service not necessary



Additional High Priority/High Risk Projects

India Basin (bid Q1 2022) – application for primary service has been submitted to PG&E in order to move project forward under current WDT3 agreement; primary service not necessary.

GGP Middle Lake Restoration - (bid Q3 2022) additional load needed for new pump – application for secondary service submitted before the April 15 WDT3 deadline; PG&E rejected the application. Pump was removed from project scope due to insufficient funds for primary service. PG&E caused project delay.

Ocean Beach Climate Adaptation Project

Restroom – designing an off-the-grid building as the space and cost required to provide primary service is prohibitive.

SUMMARY

All of these RPD properties can be served with secondary service-loads under 400kVA



The San Francisco Recreation and Park Department's Mission is to provide enriching recreational activities, maintain beautiful parks and preserve the environment for the well-being of everyone in our diverse community. WDT3 Primary Service requirement is in conflict with Recreation and Parks Department Mission.

Primary switchgear results in precious Recreation and Open Space lost permanently for installation of unnecessary utility infrastructure.

+\$500K to \$1M per project means fewer new parks and park improvements.

WDT3 will impact RPD's ability to deliver the 2020 Health and Recovery Bond projects.

PG&E caused delay has resulted in years of the community's use of recreation and open space lost.
