Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Planning Department, in cooperation with the Mayor's Office of Housing, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency, the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, and other Bay Area entities, to apply for a planning grant from the State of California Sustainable Communities Planning Grant and Incentives Program under the Safe Drinking Water, Water Quality and Supply, Flood Control, River and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2006 (Proposition 84) to develop a Multi-City Bay Area Core Regional Growth and Investment Strategy.

WHEREAS, the Legislature and Governor of the State of California have provided funds for the program shown above; and

WHEREAS, the Strategic Growth Council has been delegated the responsibility for the administration of this grant program, establishing necessary procedures; and

WHEREAS, said procedures established by the Strategic Growth Council require a resolution certifying the approval by the City's governing board before submission of said application to the State; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Department, if selected, will enter into an agreement with the State of California to carry out the development of a Multi-City Bay Area Core Regional Growth and Investment Strategy; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors approves the filing of an application for the Greenway Network Plan in order to become a sustainable community; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Planning Department understands the assurances and certification in the application; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Planning Department will have sufficient funds to develop the Proposal or will secure the resources to do so; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Proposal will comply with any applicable laws and regulations; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Director of the Planning Department, or a designee, is hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the City and County of San Francisco all necessary applications, contracts, payment requests, agreements and amendments hereto for the purpose of securing grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the grant application; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco authorizes the submittal of additional grant applications by the Planning Department to the Strategic Growth Council for all available grants and this resolution shall remain in effect for five (5) years.
