IUrging Pacific Gas and Electric to Cooperate with the City's Request for Infrastructure Information1

Resolution urging Pacific Gas and Electric Company to cooperate completely and swiftly with all requests from the City Administrator and Fire Chief in a Utility Infrastructure Safety Review, and to provide all relevant City Departments with risk level and maintenance plan information for existing pipelines in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, The violent explosion that occurred in San Bruno on Thursday, September 9, 2010 was a horrific tragedy which killed at least four people, destroyed nearly 40 homes and damaged dozens of others, and displaced hundreds of residents; and,

WHEREAS. The explosion has been attributed to a gas pipeline previously identified as "high risk" by State and Federal agencies; and,

WHEREAS, The California State Public Utilities Commission has directed PG&E to test the natural gas lines in its territory; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors reaffirms that protecting the safety and security of San Francisco residents is of the highest priority, and that any infrastructure categorized as "high risk" should be immediately identified and shared with all relevant public safety agencies; and,

WHEREAS. The Mayor has appointed the Chief of the San Francisco Fire Department and the City Administrator to lead a Utility Infrastructure Safety Review to work immediately with PG&E and receive a complete assessment of the condition and location of natural gas transmission lines in San Francisco; therefore, be it

RESOLVED. The Board of Supervisors urges PG&E to comply with the City's request for a Utility Infrastructure Safety Review in a timely and forthright manner, and provide all

requested information completely so that the City Administrator and Fire Chief can effectively complete their review; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That such information should include the age and maintenance history of gas mains in San Francisco, and the timeline and testing protocol PG&E will employ to comply with the CPUC's mandate; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors urges PG&E to work with the City in providing the results of this review to all relevant city departments, and to detail their emergency response strategy for addressing a potential accident involving PG&E gas lines in San Francisco; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors calls for an initial report on the Utility Infrastructure Safety Review, at a hearing within 45 days of the adoption of this Resolution, to identify relevant infrastructure information that the City will request of PG&E.
