Rosario Anaya Biography

Rosario Anaya is the Executive Director of Mission Language and Vocational School, Inc. (MLVS). She is from Cochabamba, Bolivia. She received a B.A. in Public Administration and a Masters Degree in Counseling and Psychology from the University of San Francisco. Since 1973, she has been responsible for the direction and administration of MLVS' employment and training programs. Her duties include implementation of MLVS policies and procedures, monitoring program development and operation, fundraising and public relations.

During the years that Ms. Anaya has served as Executive Director, MLVS has purchased the school's 50,000 square feet facility. Each year, up to 300 trainees graduate and are placed in jobs. MLVS has strengthened ties between the school and private industry and has created vocational English as Second Language materials for publication and nationwide distribution.

Ms. Anaya was appointed to the San Francisco Board of Education by late Mayor George Moscone. In citywide elections, she was elected to a 4-year term in 1978, 1982 and 1986, each time elected with the highest number of votes. She also served twice as School Board President and was the first Latin American woman elected to public office in the City's history.

Ms. Anaya is a former member of the Saint Francis Memorial Hospital Community Outreach Advisory Committee, as well as a Board Member of the Volunteers of America Bay Area, Inc. She has been a member of the Board of the Council of Great City Schools and Vice-President of the National Hispanic School Board Members Association. She has been a workshop facilitator for the National and California School Board Associations, and an appointee to the State Education Innovation and Planning Commission as well as the State Superintendent's Council on Hispanic Affairs.

Some of the awards that Ms. Anaya has received are from the Volunteers of America Bay Area, Inc., Real Alternative Program, Inc., Association of Latin American Students (ALAS) Woodrow Wilson High School, the Labor Council for Latin American Advancement, the Puerto Rican Organization for Women, the Irish-Israeli-Italian Society, the East Bay International Institute, the Association of Mexican-American Educators, the Protagonist Club, the Greenlining Institute, the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Californians for Solar and Clean Energy, and Hispanic Women Making History. She was honored by the President of the Republic of Venezuela with the Order of Francisco de Miranda Medallion.

Among other activities, under former Mayors, Ms. Anaya has chaired the Planning, Housing and Economic Development committee of the Mission Neighborhood Task Force and the Youth Guidance Center committee, and served on the KQED Board of Directors, the YWCA Board of Directors, and co-chaired the San Francisco-Caracas Sister City Committee. In December 2000, Ms. Anaya was appointed by the San Francisco Unified School District (SFUSD) to serve in the City's Digital Divide Task Force, and she has also served on the USF School of Education Advisory Board and the St. Luke's Hospital Community Advisory Council. In 2001 Ms. Anaya was voted onto the Board of Directors of the Greenlining Institute, and also currently sits on the board of New America Media. In addition, Ms. Anaya is a member of the Latino-Jewish Relations Committee and the San Francisco Latino Coalition.

Board Qualifications:

The Redevelopment Agency consists of seven members appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Board of Supervisors. At least one member must be a woman. A member may not be an elective officer or an employee of the community, but notwithstanding any other law, he or she may be a member, commissioner, or employee of any other agency or authority of, or created for, the community.

Three of the members first appointed shall be designated to serve the terms of one, two, and three years, respectively, from the date of their appointments and two shall be designated to serve for terms of four years from the date of their appointments. If and when the membership of the agency is increased to seven, one of the additional members shall be appointed to a term, or unexpired portion thereof, which is concurrent with the term then held by the member originally appointed for a term of three years or by his successor, and the other additional member shall be appointed to a term, or unexpired portion thereof, which is concurrent with the term then held by the member originally appointed for a term of two years or by his successor. Their successors shall be appointed for four-year terms. Vacancies occurring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired term. A member shall hold office until his successor has been appointed and has qualified.

The San Francisco Redevelopment Agency was established for the purpose of improving the environment of the City and creating better urban living conditions through the removal of blight. Authorized and organized under the provisions of the California Community Redevelopment Law, the Agency is an entity legally separate from the City and County of San

Francisco, but existing solely to perform certain functions exclusively for and by authorization of the City and County of San Francisco. The Agency operates primarily in redevelopment project areas designated by the Board of Supervisors. The Agency also provides local funding for the development of affordable housing throughout the City.

Reports: The Redevelopment Agency shall file with the Board of Supervisors a detailed report of all its transactions, including a statement of all revenues and expenditures at quarterly intervals.
