IUrging the Mayor to Immediately Establish a COVID Coordination Team to Address the

Omicron Variant Surge and Other Possible Variant Surges]

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Resolution urging the Mayor, Department of Public Health, Office of Economic and Workforce Development, Department of Emergency Management, and Human Services Agency to immediately establish a COVID Coordination Team to address the Omicron Variant Surge and other possible variant surges.

WHEREAS, On February 25, 2020, the Mayor issued a Proclamation declaring a local emergency to exist in connection with the imminent spread within San Francisco of a novel Coronavirus ("COVID-19"); and

WHEREAS, On March 3, 2020, Board of Supervisors concurred in the Mayor's Proclamation to meet the emergency need; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is on its Forty-Second Supplement of the initial Proclamation declaring the existence of local emergency; and

WHEREAS, The Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD) is experiencing three to four times as many applications to its COVID Right to Recover Program compared to 2021 and if this rate continues, the program could be out of funding by the end of February or early March 2022; and

WHEREAS, Community testing sites are experiencing record numbers of staff shortages and record numbers of participants seeking COVID-19 testing while the City appears to be divesting support and resources to these sites during the surge; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has nearly ended the deployment of staff from other non-essential departments to perform Disaster Service Work (DSW) in addressing the COVID-19 pandemic; and

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WHEREAS, Department of Public Health (DPH) employees are experiencing high levels of burnout, COVID-19 exposure, sickness, and understaffing in all divisions, especially at the San Francisco General Hospital emergency room and intensive care unit, where staffing numbers are declining at unprecedented rates and the need for more staffing is immediate: and

WHEREAS, In Fall 2021, the City and County of San Francisco stopped supporting community-based agencies with personal protective equipment such as N-95 masks and general surgical masks to support vulnerable populations like seniors, children, and the City's unhoused population; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Human Resources (DHR) ended COVID-19 sick leave, on December 31, 2021, and is now offering paid administrative leave for employees impacted by COVID related issues; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Emergency Management (DEM) on December 31, 2021, transitioned majority of its focus away from the COVID-19 crisis and relinquished most of its responsibility back to DPH; and

WHEREAS, The City's COVID Economic Response and Loss Reserve has been fully allocated with \$99.5 million allocated for Fiscal Year 2021- 2022 and 14 million for Fiscal Year 2022- 2023 budgets; and

WHEREAS, Neighboring Bay Area counties like Sonoma County are urging residents to voluntarily stay at home and limit going out as much as possible for the next 30 days to stop the spread of the Omicron variant of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, Private providers are not doing their fair share of testing to meet the needs of their patients, which is causing patients to overly rely on DPH affiliated community testing and vaccination hubs; and

 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Health relies on COLOR, a COVID-19 testing vendor, for DPH affiliated COVID-19 testing sites and has not adequately scaled its internal testing capacity or the vendor's capacity; and

WHEREAS, On January 10, 2022, COLOR experienced a nationwide computer failure that stopped its ability to perform COVID-19 testing at several DPH affiliated COVID-19 community testing sites and previous COVID-19 tests are taking four to five days to render results during this current surge of the Omicron variant; and

WHEREAS, The shortage of booster shots in the November 2021 left our seniors and vulnerable residents in San Francisco unprotected and unable to endure long lines to get their booster shots; and

WHEREAS, The reduction of isolation and quarantine beds for our most vulnerable residents who are often housed in crowded living conditions is resulting in rapid infection rates of COVID-19 Omicron Variant; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco must reinstate COVID-19 community testing and vaccine pop-up sites for areas that do not have a semi-permanent community testing and vaccine site; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco must continue to support to San Francisco Unified School District with personal protective equipment, COVID-19 testing and vaccinations; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor,

Department of Public Health, Office of Economic and Workforce Development, Department of

Emergency Management, and Human Services Agency to immediately reestablish an interim

COVID Command Center to address the Omicron surge; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor to immediately establish a COVID Coordination Team to address Omicron Variant Surge and other possible

variant surges and to require this team led by the Department of Public Health to present to the Board every two months for the next six months; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit a copy of this resolution to the Mayor's Office, Department of Emergency Management, Department of Public Health, Office of Economic and Workforce Development and Human Services Agency.
