

1 [Accept and Expend Grant - Retroactive - National Institutes of Health - Heluna Health - Pre-  
2 Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)-3D: An Integrated Pharmacy Digital Diary and Delivery Strategy  
3 to Increase PrEP Use Among Men Who Have Sex With Men - \$334,576]

4 **Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Public Health to accept and**  
5 **expend a grant increase from the National Institutes of Health through Heluna Health**  
6 **for participation in a program, entitled “Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)-3D: An**  
7 **Integrated Pharmacy Digital Diary and Delivery Strategy to Increase Pre-Exposure**  
8 **Prophylaxis (PrEP) Use Among Men Who Have Sex With Men (MSM),” in the amount of**  
9 **\$95,985 for the period of April 1, 2020, through March 31, 2021, and in the amount of**  
10 **\$166,602 for the period of April 1, 2021, through March 31, 2022, for a total amount of**  
11 **\$334,576 for the total grant period of April 8, 2019, through March 31, 2022.**

13 WHEREAS, The National Institutes of Health (NIH), through Heluna Health (HH) as a  
14 pass-through entity, has agreed to fund the Department of Public Health (DPH) in the amount  
15 of \$334,576 for participation in a program, entitled “Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)-3D: An  
16 Integrated Pharmacy Digital Diary and Delivery Strategy to Increase Pre-Exposure  
17 Prophylaxis (PrEP) Use Among Men Who Have Sex With Men (MSM),” for the period of April  
18 8, 2019, to March 31, 2022; and

19 WHEREAS, MSM are the population most affected by human immunodeficiency virus  
20 (HIV) in the United States, accounting for over two-thirds of all new HIV diagnoses; and

21 WHEREAS, PrEP has demonstrated high levels of efficacy for HIV prevention among  
22 MSM; and

23 WHEREAS, A pharmacy-led model of PrEP delivery, combined with mobile app-based  
24 PrEP support, could address many of the challenges with starting and staying on PrEP, and  
25 also greatly reduce burden on the medical system; and

1 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance Amendment; and

2 WHEREAS, A grant increase of \$95,985 and \$166,602 for a total increase of \$262,587  
3 from \$71,989 was approved for the period of April 1, 2020, through March 31, 2022; and

4 WHEREAS, A request for retroactive approval is being sought because DPH received  
5 the award agreements on August 21, 2020, for a project start date of April 1, 2020, and on  
6 October 25, 2021, for a project start date of April 1, 2021; and

7 WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs in the amount of  
8 \$66,915; now, therefore, be it

9 RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend a grant  
10 in the amount of \$334,576 from the NIH through HH; and, be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and  
12 expend the grant funds pursuant to Administrative Code, Section 10.170-1; and, be it

13 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the  
14 Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

15 FURTHER RESOLVED, That within thirty (30) days of the Grant Agreement being fully  
16 executed by all parties, the Director of Health shall provide a copy to the Clerk of the Board of  
17 Supervisors for inclusion in the official file.
