- **8.** Proposed Grant Project Summary:

The Southern Skyline Blvd Ridge Trail will enhance the existing Fifield-Cahill Ridge Trail, and create a new six mile segment of Bay Area Ridge Trail—the Southern Skyline Boulevard Ridge Trail—through the interior of the Peninsula Watershed, property owned and maintained by the SFPUC. The Bay Area Ridge Trail was started in 1987 by the Bay Area Ridge Trail Council to create an approximately 550-mile long continuous trail for hikers, mountain bicyclists, and equestrians along the ridgelines overlooking San Francisco Bay. Currently, 360 miles of the Bay Area Ridge Trail have been constructed.

FHWA grant and SFPUC matching funds will be used for construction of the 6-mile long multi-modal segment of the Bay Area Ridge Trail south of Route 92 and west of the Crystal Springs Reservoir in San Mateo County. Due to steep terrain and dense vegetation, this portion of watershed is currently inaccessible to the public.

In addition to the grant funded segment of the Bay Area Ridge Trail, the SFPUC's project will construct an ADA compliant universal access loop adjacent to an existing section of the Fifield Cahill Ridge Trail which is located north of Route 92.

The goal of the SSBRTE Project is to enhance public access to SFPUC watershed lands, provide recreational opportunities for Bay Area residents, protect natural resources and water quality, and lastly to provide educational opportunities related to the Watershed ecosystem.
